

Botswana Food & Beverage Imports

June 2026

In June 2026, Botswana received imports worth **P7, 280.5 million**. In this amount, Food & Beverages imports amounted to **P1, 091.2 million**, representing **15.0 percent** of total imports. Cereals (Chapter 10) and Beverages, Spirits & Vinegar (Chapter 22) were the leading imported chapters among Food & Beverages imports with contribution of **16.9 percent** and **12.7 percent**, respectively.

Cereals emerged as the most prominent commodity imported during the period under review. Within this commodity group, the leading imported products were *Other maize (corn)* (HS100590), *Other wheat, other than durum wheat* (HS100199), and *Semi-milled or wholly milled rice, whether or not polished or glazed* (HS100630). These products accounted for 43.2 percent, 29.3 percent, and 22.4 percent of total cereal imports, respectively. This could be highlighting the country's strong reliance on Cereal imports to meet domestic demand.

Beverages, Spirits & Vinegar was the second dominant commodity imported. The major food products imported among this sector are Beer made from malt (HS220300) and Other fermented beverages, (for example, cider, perry, mead, sake), mixtures of fermented beverages & mixtures of fermented beverages & non-alcoholic beverage (HS220600) with contributions of 36.6 percent and 16.9 percent. Waters, including mineral waters and aerated waters, containing added sugar or other sweetening matter or flavored (HS 220210) and Other waters (HS220299) followed with a contribution of 12.6 percent and 10.0 percent in that order.

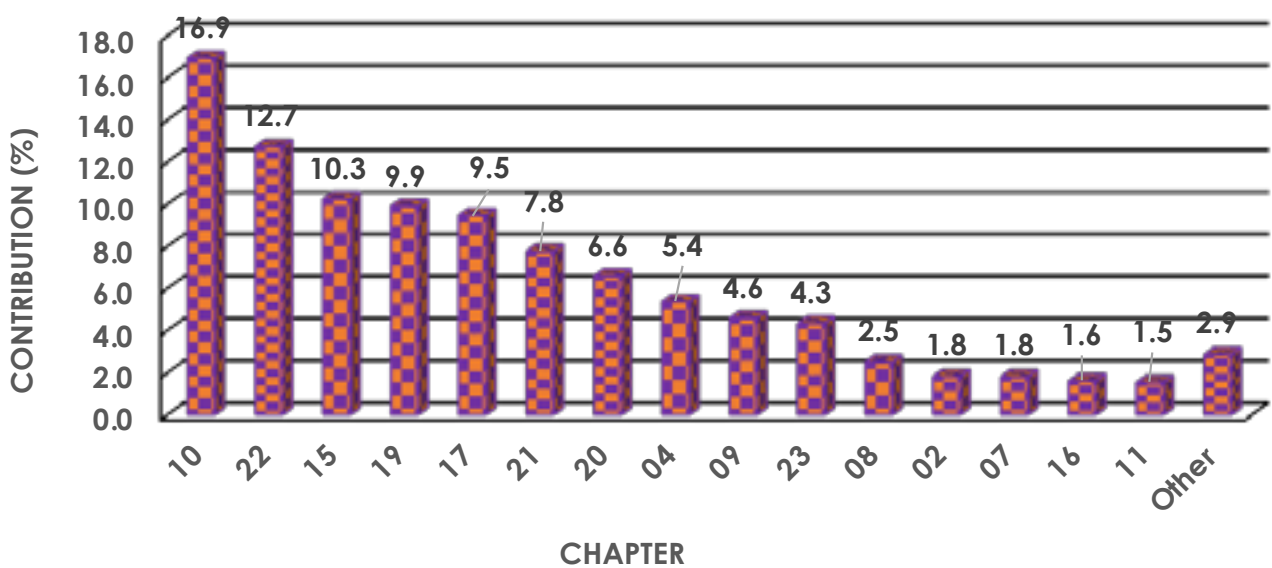


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Percentage Distribution of Botswana Food imports by Chapter – June 2026
