BOTSWANA FOOD & BEVERAGES IMPORTS

September 2024



Botswana's total imports were valued at P7, 865.1 million during September 2024. In this amount, food and beverages imports amounted to P1, 192.6 million, representing 15.2 percent of total imports. Beverages, Spirits & Vinegar (Chapter 22) and Cereals (Chapter 10) accounted for 18.3 percent and 13.7 percent of food & beverages imports in that order. Miscellaneous edible preparations (Chapter 21) followed with a contribution of 9.2 percent.

During September 2024, Beverages, spirits &vinegar were the dominant commodity imported. Among Beverages, spirits & vinegar, the Beer made from malt and Other fermented beverages (for example, cider, perry, mead, sake), mixtures of fermented beverages, mixtures of fermented beverages & non-alcoholic beverages were leading with contributions of 30.9 percent and 21.0 percent in chapter 22. Other waters, including mineral waters aerated, containing added sugar or flavored & non-alcoholic beverages (excluding fruit, nut or vegetable juices) and Waters, including mineral waters and aerated waters, containing added sugar or other sweetening matter or flavored followed with contributions of 16.6 percent and 9.2 percent to chapter 22 respectively.


Among the Cereals imports, the most prominent commodity was Other Maize (corn) accounting for 49.7 percent. Semi-milled or wholly milled rice, whether or not polished or glazed and Other Wheat and muslin, not durum wheat other than seed followed with a contribution of 30.8 percent and 6.9 percent respectively.
