Definition of terms

A **full-time student** is someone who is enrolled in an education programme whose intended study load amounts to at least 75% of the normal full-time annual study load.

A **part-time student** is someone who is enrolled in an education programme whose intended study load is less than 75% of the normal full-time annual study load.

First-time entrants into tertiary education are students who are enrolling in tertiary education for the first time, without previous education at any other tertiary level. They may enter tertiary education at different levels through short-cycle tertiary (ISCED 5) or bachelor's (ISCED 6).

Gross Enrolment Ratio is the number of students enrolled in a level of education, whether or not they belong in the relevant age group for that level, as a percentage of the population in the relevant age group for that level. Estimates are based on the UNESCO's classification of education levels.

Inbound students are students who left their country of origin and moved to another country for the purpose of study.

Other private entities include private businesses and non-profit organisations (e.g. religious organisations, charitable organisations, business and labour associations, and other non-profit organisations).

Net Enrolment Ratio is the number of students enrolled in a level of education who belong in the relevant age group, as a percentage of the population in the age group.

Research and development includes research performed at universities and other tertiary educational institutions, regardless of whether the research is financed from general institutional funds or through separate grants or contracts from public or private sponsors

Tertiary Education -a programme which is offered beyond the level of senior secondary education, including technical and vocational education and training (TVET) and such programmes with a set with a set theoretical foundation, through to advanced research qualifications.

Tertiary Education Institution - a public or private post-secondary education and training institution including a university.

Vocational Education and Training (VET) programmes- prepare participants for direct entry into specific occupations without further training. Successful completion of such programmes leads to a vocational or technical qualification that is relevant to the labour market.

Executive Summary

This 2021 Tertiary Education Statistics Report gives the education landscape and a snapshot of indicators for all formal post-secondary education, including public and private universities, colleges, technical training institutes, and vocational schools. These Tertiary Education Institutions (TEIs) enrol students to study for different programmes annually mainly to provide them with qualifications, and also with adequate and relevant job skills to enter the labour market, thus making the tertiary education indicators beneficial to policy makers on both the supply and the demand side. The report's focus was on TEIs whose accreditation was valid as of 1st October 2020 and provides comprehensive statistics and indicators for the academic year ending 31st May 2021. The report presents the following key highlights:

- In 2021, a total of 61,157 students were enrolled and studying for different tertiary qualifications in local institutions: 54,329 were enrolled in Higher Education Institutions and 6,816 enrolled in Vocational Education Institutions. Among the factors influencing enrolment at TEIs, sex of the student tends to influence the programme of choice as females were more likely to enrol in higher education institutions than in Technical Vocational Education and Training (TVET) institutions and the Brigades. In general, females make up 58 percent (35,317) of the total 2021 tertiary enrolment.
- Majority of the enrolments (24,673) were in public universities: Botswana International University of Science and Technology (BIUST), Botswana Open University (BOU), Botswana University of Agriculture and Natural Resources (BUAN) and University of Botswana (UB). The UB was the only institution with more than 10,000 students. In spite of a higher number of accredited public tertiary institutions, the four public Colleges of Education and the six public Institute of Health Sciences recorded an enrolment of 1,546 and 1,074 respectively. Considering that these institutions had previously enrolled larger numbers than they did in 2021, it is quite possible that there is underutilisation of learning space and other resources in such institutions.
- Ninety (90) percent of the students were enrolled at undergraduate level. However, there was an increase in postgraduate enrolment from 2,479 in 2020 to 2,922 in 2021, notably the Doctor of Philosophy enrolment increased from 151 to 217. Despite female strong participation in higher education, their share decreases with higher levels of tertiary education: in 2021 females made up only 36 percent of the doctoral degree enrolment.
- The Business, Administration and Law field of education had the highest concentration of students constituting 29 percent of the total student population. The Science Technology, Engineering and Mathematics (STEM) cumulatively accounted for 32 percent of the total enrolment. Women were also less likely than men to enter a STEM field of study, although their share has increased slightly between 2015 to date.
- Foreign students accounted for 2.2 percent (1,327) of the total enrolment and highest share came from the SADC neighbouring countries. A total of 59 foreign students were enrolled for doctoral degree.
- The 2021 Gross Enrolment Ratio was 21.0, a slight increase of 1.5 from the previous academic year. If the current pattern continues, it is expected that less than a quarter of the tertiary age population are likely to be enrolled in the next four years.
- A total of 11,859 students graduated from Botswana's tertiary education institutions. This was a decrease of 104 graduates from the previous academic year. The 2021 graduation rate stood at 81.6 percent.
- About a quarter of upper secondary graduates transited to tertiary institution in 2021. Furthermore a total of 9,458 (17.4%) students were registered as first-time entrants into tertiary education for the academic year 2020/21.

-
- The public sector through the Department of Tertiary Education Financing (DTEF) is the main sponsor (67%) of tertiary education students. The share of private funding and other private entities is generally low despite the influx of private provision of education at tertiary level.
 - A gender gap exist between teachers employed at tertiary level. Male teachers made up about 58 percent as compared to 42 percent of females. However factors attracting male teachers to the profession were unknown and further research on the issue is recommended.

Introduction

Section 4 part 2 (f) of the Human Resource Development Council (HRDC) Act of 2013 requires the HRDC to establish and manage a national labour market information system and the national education and skills database. In pursuance of this mandate, HRDC conducts the tertiary education institutional census and produce reports on an annual basis. The 2021 Tertiary Education Statistics Report is the seventh publication and presents the state of tertiary education in Botswana as at May 2021. The report is informed by statistical data collected from tertiary education institutions annually, together with supplementary data from Botswana Examinations Council and Statistics Botswana. It is geared towards the implementation of Council's strategic plan objective of coordinating the production of education and labour market indicators. It presents real time statistics, data and indicators on the tertiary education landscape and plays a pivotal role in providing baseline data for planning and evidence based decision making for the education sector.

Objectives of the report

The objectives of the 2021 report are to:

- 1) Produce the 2021 tertiary education indicators
- 2) Provide baseline statistics
- 3) Support monitoring and implementation of sector projects

Context of the Report

The 2021 tertiary education statistics report offers a comprehensive and up-to-date array of indicators that monitors performance of tertiary education. The indicators presented in this year's edition provides information on access, participation and progression through education, as well as the outcomes of education across a number of equity dimensions such as sex, country of origin and subnational regions. The report presents transition rate from upper secondary to Tertiary Education Institutions (TEIs), the total number of students disaggregated by programmes of study qualifications, age and sex among others. Furthermore, it presents the enrolment ratios and their trends from 2009 to date and gives a snapshot on the participation of tertiary education students from other countries coming to study in local tertiary institutions.

The report highlights the tertiary education indicators as outlined in the United Nations Educational Scientific and Cultural Organisation (UNESCO) technical guide. . Nonetheless, there has been a number of challenges which limit reporting on certain indicators. Furthermore, variations exists in data management systems of different institutions; ranging from complex and sophisticate systems to manual. Data collection from institutions is not yet automated and hence makes collection and analysis to be laborious. Notwithstanding the above, the quality of data have remained satisfactory over the years.

Methodology

Scope

The tertiary education institutional census covered a total of 44 Tertiary Education Institutions; 40 Higher Education Institutions (HEIs) and four technical colleges under the Ministry of Education and Skills Development (MOESD) and 36 vocational training institutions made of 32 Brigades and four Vocational Training Centres (VTC). Data collection excluded data on short courses with the duration of up to six months. The data collection instrument comprised of a fourteen paged Microsoft excel template. TEIs were required to complete the templates from 1st of October 2020 to the 31st of March 2021. Other administrative records were sourced from key stakeholders such as Statistics Botswana, Botswana Examination Council (BEC) and the 2020 budget speech.

Approach/Method

TEIs were primary source of information on student and staff. Other supporting information used was from secondary sources and included a total number of students who sat for the Botswana General Certificate of Secondary Education (BGCSE) from the BEC and projected population aged 18-24 by Statistics Botswana.

Response Rate

The response rate from tertiary education institutions with respect to census is as per table 1 below;

Transition

Transition from Basic to Tertiary Education

Pathways through education can be diverse from country to another. Different systems are put in place to ensure that students have suitable opportunities to attain adequate levels of education in order to progress through to other different levels of an educational system. In Botswana, the traditional route of entering tertiary education is the successful completion of the highest basic education level (senior/upper secondary school), through a syllabus- based assessment called Botswana General Certificate of Secondary Education and other equivalent assessments.

By end of academic year 2019 a total of 36,508 candidates sat for the BGCSE examination of which majority 21,130 (57.6 %) were from Government schools, 8,680 (23.8 %) from Botswana Open University (BOU), 3,976 (10.9 %) BEC Centres and 2,722 (7.7%) from Private schools. The following table presents the total number of students who sat for the BGCSE (and/or its equivalent) in the respective years.

First-time entrants into tertiary education

Indicator

First-time entrants into tertiary education refers to the new students admitted into tertiary education for the very first time in a given year. The level at which students first enter tertiary education depends on the upper secondary programme they graduated from. In Botswana entry into tertiary education can be at ISCED 4, 5 or 6.

A total of 9,458² (17.4%) students were registered as first-time entrants into tertiary education for the academic year 2020/21. Further analysis indicated that the majority (44%) enrolled with the University of Botswana while the remaining was distributed among all other institutions. Figure 1 below shows the trends of new entrants for the 2020/21.

Transition Rate

Using the first time entrants and the 2019 total number of BGCSE candidates (36,508) to calculate the transition rate, the data shows that only 25.9 percent of the BGCSE candidates managed to transit to tertiary education in 2020. This is a decrease of 8.3 percent from the 2019/20 transition rate which stood at 34.2 percent.



Participation in tertiary education


Figure 2 shows that the majority of students, 24,673 (40%) were in public universities. The Institute of Health Sciences (IHS) and the four Vocational Training Centres (VTCs) were the least and each accounted for two percent only. In summary, the distribution as per figure 2 shows that the public tertiary institutions attracted the majority of students, accounting for 71.0 percent of total enrolment in 2020/21.

During the 2020/21 academic year, a total of 61,157 students were enrolled in tertiary studies in Botswana. Figure 2 is the distribution of the tertiary enrolment by type of institution.

Tertiary Enrolments Trends

Botswana's tertiary education statistics trend indicate that tertiary enrolments were quite inconsistent. Available information shows that tertiary enrolments had relatively been increasing over the past ten years and recorded the highest of 60,583 in 2014/15 academic year with the lowest of 37,859 during the 2010/11.

From the 61,157³ students that were enrolled, there was an increase of 7.9 percent (4,491) from the previous academic year which had an enrolment of 56,666⁴ students. Figure 3 shows the tertiary education enrolment trend from academic years 2009/20 to 2020/21.


Tertiary Enrolment Trend-disaggregated in to private and public

Over the past two decades, the number of private institutions has increased to meet the growing demand for enrolment in tertiary education and students had the possibility to choose between enrolling in public or private institutions. Figure 4 summarises the enrolment trends by institution type.

- Total enrolment for HEIs dropped from 56,666 in 2019/20 to 54,341
- Enrolment in Private Institutions dropped by 2,038 Students
- Enrolment in Public Institutions dropped by 287 students
- Vocational Training Centres and Brigades institutions enrolled 6,816 students.

Gender Parity Index for Tertiary Enrolment

Gender parity index (GPI) for tertiary enrolment is the ratio of women to men enrolled at tertiary level in public and private tertiary education institutions. A GPI of less than 1 indicates women are more disadvantaged than men in learning opportunities and a GPI of greater than 1 suggests otherwise. .

From a gender perspective, women are more likely than men to access higher education institutions in Botswana. Table 3 shows that this gender gap in favour of women has widened between 2017 and 2020. On the other hand, the Vocational Institutions were dominated by males.

Majority of the students (24,673) were enrolled in public universities which is made up of Botswana International University of Science and Technology (BIUST), Botswana Open University (BOU), Botswana University of Agriculture and Natural Resources (BUAN), and University of Botswana (UB). The lowest enrolment, (1,074) was recorded at the six public Institute of Health Sciences. Female enrolment was 35,317 and accounted for almost 58 percent of the total enrolment. A relatively higher share of female enrolment than male enrolment was observed across all the different types of institutions except for the TVET institutions (Table 4).



Enrolment by ISCED field of Education

The enrolments were classified in accordance with the ISCED 2013, an approach where subjects are grouped together to form the broad, narrow fields of classification, based on the similarity of the subject matter (UNESCO, 2014, p.6). ISCED classify education programmes and their related qualifications by fields of education and training on the basis of the content of the programme. Figure 5 summarises the tertiary enrolment by ISCED field of education.



The aggregate data mask important gender disparities within the fields of study: women dominate in education, social sciences and in health and welfare. This gender pattern was also revealed in the Organisation for Economic Co-operation and Development (OECD) indicator where most countries indicated that women dominated in health and welfare, but were under-represented in the broad field of science, technology, engineering and mathematics (OECD, 2019, p.6)



Student Enrolment by mode of Study

Local institutions have adopted different modes of study in order to match the high demand for tertiary education. Traditionally these institutions were using the full time face-to-face mode of teaching and learning. However, of late, institutions have embraced other modes of learning such as part-time and distance learning. This initiative by institutions endeavours to be more inclusive and broadens the student base. Where the institution offers more than one mode of study the learners have the liberty to make choice of programmes taking into consideration available options of the mode of study. Analysis of the study mode for the 54,341 students enrolled in TEIs was as per figure 7 below:

Figure 7: 2021 Student Enrolment by study mode





The most popular study mode was full time, followed by distance and part-time. Colleges of education and Institutes of health sciences across the country use only one mode, being the fulltime mode. It should be noted that the 5,774 enrolled on distance mode under public universities were all from the Botswana Open University.

Student Enrolment by type of Sponsorship

The Department of Tertiary Education Financing (DTEF) is the main sponsor of tertiary education in Botswana. This financial year alone, the government sponsored a total of 36,307 (67 percent) students to Higher Education Institutions operating in Botswana. This is a decrease from 39,446 students who were sponsored during the last financial year. The second largest were those on self-sponsorship with 29 percent (15,833) and the remaining 4 percent (2,201) was being shared by other private sponsors. Figure 8 below present 2021 student enrolment by sponsorship type.



Trends of Tertiary Students on Government sponsorship

Figure 9 shows the trends in the number of students sponsored by the government through the Department of Tertiary Education Financing¹⁰ between 2008/9 and 2020/21.

Figure 9 indicates that there was an increasing trend in the number of tertiary education students on Government sponsorship i.e increased from 28,976 in 2009/10 to 48,703 in 2012/13. Thereafter, the number of tertiary education students on Government sponsorship gradually decreased from 48,703 in 2012/13 to 38,806 in 2016/17. In 2020, the total number of sponsored students was 39,446, however the number decreased to 36,307 in 2021. One of the major reasons could be the fact that government had to re-align the ministerial budgets in order to avail funds to mitigate the consequences of global COVID 19 pandemic.



Number of Outbound students on government sponsorship

Around the world, there is growing interest among national governments to initiate or expand scholarship programmes that provide citizens with the opportunity to study outside their home country (Rumbley, 2014). The OECD among others views the initiative as an opportunity to access high- quality education, acquire skills that may not be taught at home and get closer to labour markets that offer higher returns on education (OECD Report, 2021).

The Government of Botswana like others, invest in their citizens through scholarship programmes for international study. Analysis showed that while a total of 61,157 students are studying locally, just 808 of the student population received national government support to study at international institutions. Of these 112 are on partial sponsorship (donor scholarship) and the rest are fully sponsored by the government. Table 14 shows the number of outbound students by country of placement.

The Gross Enrolment Ratio (GER) is one of the key indicators in the education sector. It determines the level of participation in tertiary education system and indicates the ratio of enrolment in tertiary education to the total population of the eligible group which is 18 – 24 in Botswana. The GER is often used internationally to compare participation in education across various countries (Khuluvhe and Ganyaupfu, 2021). Table 15 below presents the total student enrolment, projected 18-24 age population cohort and the calculated GER for the past fourteen years to date.



In 2021 the Gross Enrolment Ratio was 21.0, an increase of 1.5 from 2020. The highest Gross Enrolment Ratio recorded in Botswana was 21.3 in 2015 and thereafter it has been fluctuating below 20 percent indicating a relatively low participation in tertiary education in Botswana.

Figure 11: Gross Enrolment Ratio-Comparisons 2012-2021





Figure 11 shows GER trends comparisons¹⁷ between Botswana and other countries/regions. It is quite notable from figure 11 that tertiary GERs remain quite low for most countries in the sub-Saharan region. The 2021 Botswana’s GER of 21.0 is higher than the averages of the Sub-Saharan African region (9.4%). However, it was significantly below the Upper middle income countries average at 57.6, lower middle income countries at 23.7% and the world average at 40.2%. Mauritius has consistently been among the highest in Sub Saharan Africa over in the last 10 years.

Contrary to the status quo in sub-Saharan Africa, women are advantaged in terms of participation in tertiary education in Botswana. The tertiary GER in Botswana for women was 23.7%, compared to 18.3% for men.

Net Enrolment Ratio

The Net Enrolment Ratio (NER) for the tertiary school level is the ratio of the total enrolment for the official age group (18-24) to the population of the same age group in a given year. It is one of the most important and cited education indicators for the Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs) to which Botswana as a country is committed to. The indicator is used to monitor government education policies and programs as well as identify areas that need intervention. The 2021 NER for Botswana was 12.2 percent




Tertiary graduation rate

Tertiary graduation rate illustrates a country's capacity to provide future workers with advanced and specialised knowledge and skills. During the academic year 2020/21, the total tertiary graduation rate was reported to be 81.6 percent, a decrease of 0.5 percentage points from 2019 graduates.

Figure 14 reflects that the undergraduates form the highest share of the 2020 tertiary education graduates (96 percent). The Bachelor's degree was the highest with 49 percent, diploma and certificate with a share of 31 and 11 percent respectively.





Proportion of national wealth spent on educational institutions is an indicator that demonstrates the priority given to educational institutions as a function of countries' overall resources (OECD report, 2021). This indicator provides an explanation that links investment in higher education with an overall higher rate of fostering economic growth and enhance productivity.

Locally, the Ministerial Recurrent Budget for financial year 2020/2021 was at P51.37 (billion). The largest share, P9.01 (billion) was allocated to the Ministry of Education and Skills Development. The tertiary education was budgeted for through the then Ministry of Tertiary Education, Research, Science and Technology and was allocated P4.89 (billion). The allocation mainly provided for tertiary education student's sponsorship and tertiary education public institution's subventions. Proportion of national wealth spent on educational institutions as an indicator covers expenditure on colleges, universities and other public institutions involved in delivering or supporting tertiary educational services. Other ministerial budget allocation are reflected in figure 16 below.



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

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
