# TOURISM: INTERNATIONAL VISITOR ARRIVALS STATS BRIEF Q2 2022

The country received a total of 248,946 international visitors (tourists) during the second quarter of 2022. These represented 88.2 percent of total non-citizen arrivals (282,220) the bulk of whom emanated from the SADC sub-region. South Africa contributed 79,410, representing 37.8 percent of overall tourists from SADC countries.

A total of 77,070 births (live and stillbirths) were registered in 2020, out of which about a quarter were occurrences from the previous years. From the total registered, 59,480 were current occurrences of which 834 were stillbirths.

The number of deaths registered declined from 13,185 in 2019 to 12,219 in 2020, a decline of 966 deaths. The sex ratio at death has also declined from 107 in 2019 to 104 in 2020, indicating that there are 104 male deaths per 100 female deaths in 2020. There were 6,518 marriages solemnized in 2020 an increase of 6.9 percent from the previous year.


# TOURISM STATISTICS ANNUAL REPORT 2019

A total of 2,360,834 non-citizens arrived in the country in 2019. Out of these 1,555, 399 (65.9 percent) were international visitors (tourists). Tourists refer to both overnight and same day visitors. Overnight visitors made 93.5 percent (1,454,604) while same day visitors accounted for 6.5 percent (100,795) of total visitors. This shows a 15.0 percent (53,734) decrease in the number of tourists compared to 1,830,274 in the previous year. Tourists from South Africa accounted for 35.9 percent (558,875) while those from Zimbabwe represented 30.0 percent (465,988) of total tourists during the year.

# GROSS DOMESTIC PRODUCT: FOURTH QUARTER OF 2022

The nominal Gross Domestic Product for the fourth quarter of 2022 was P65, 005.0 million compared to P63, 052.7 million registered during the previous quarter. This represents a quarterly increase of 3.1 percent in nominal terms between the two periods. During the quarter under review, Mining & Quarrying became the major contributor to GDP by 19.6 percent, followed by Public Administration and Defence at 15.4 percent. Real GDP for the fourth quarter of 2022 increased by 5.9 percent compared to the 6.0 percent growth registered in the same quarter of the previous year.



# TRANSPORT AND INFRASTRUCTURE STATISTICS QUARTER 4, 2022

A total of 8,208 vehicles were registered for the first time in Botswana in Q4 2022. Out of these vehicles 74.2 percent were used vehicles. Brand new and rebuilt vehicles made up 25.7 and 0.1 percent of the total respectively. Goods transported through rail decreased by 27.4 percent in Q4 2022 from 297 387 tonnes transported in Q3 2022 to 216,059 tonnes. A total of P46.8 million in revenue was generated, depicting a decrease of 27.4 percent from P64.5 million generated in the previous quarter, Q3 2022.


## INDEX OF THE PHYSICAL VOLUME OF MINING PRODUCTION FOURTH QUARTER 2022




# ELECTRICITY GENERATION & DISTRIBUTION STATS BRIEF, FOURTH QUARTER 2022

# BOTSWANA INFORMATION & COMMUNICATION TECHNOLOGY STATS BRIEF Q4, 2022

Internet subscriptions increased as well, by 3.6 percent, from 2,875,153 in Q3 2022 to 2,977,845. 
# BOTSWANA ENVIRONMENT STATISTICS CLIMATE DIGEST MARCH 2022

Periodicity: Bi-annual Pages: 13 Published: May 2023

Pandamatenga received the highest total rainfall in a month at 369.5 mm in January 2022 followed by Tubu recording 195.0 mm in March 2022 and Maun recording 194.4 mm in December 2021. The wettest area was Pandamatenga, recording a total of 628.2 mm followed by Good hope recording 565.0 mm and Maun recording 481.8 mm over the period of six months.

The lowest mean monthly minimum air temperature was that for Tsabong at 12.0 °C, followed by Werda at 12.7 °C and Goodhope at 13.2 °C all recorded in October 2021. The highest mean monthly maximum temperature was for Tubu at 40.5 °C in November 2021, and 38.2 °C in October 2021, followed by Mababe at 38.1 °C in November 2021. The highest maximum temperatures for the period were all recorded at Tubu as follows; 43.9 °C in October 2021, 43.6 °C in November 2021 and 43.5 °C in October 2021.

# PRODUCER PRICE INDEX (MINING AND UTILITIES) QUARTER 4, 2022

The Mining Producer Price Index moved from 132.5 in Quarter 3 of 2022 to 129.4 in Quarter 4 of 2022, registering a decline of 2.3 percent. The decrease was due to a fall in section indices of Diamond and Salt by 3.1 and 1.4 percent respectively. Other minerals, specifically Coal, Soda Ash and Gold recorded the increases of 45.2, 8.9 and 0.7 percent respectively.




# PREVALENCE OF UNDERNOURISHMENT STATISTICAL BRIEF 2015/16

Periodicity: Adhoc Pages: 11 Published: May 2023

According to the findings, 32.0 percent of the population nationwide is undernourished, meaning that there is 32.0 percent probability that upon random selection of an individual at national level, that person will be consuming food that is below their dietary energy requirement.

At the strata level, rural areas have the largest frequency of deprived people at 45.0 percent, followed by urban villages at 30.0 percent and cities and towns at 11.0 percent. The pattern is consistent with poverty incidence where poverty is higher in rural areas at 24.2 percent, followed by 13.3 percent at urban villages and 9.4 percent in cities and towns.

# PREVELANCE OF FOOD INSECURITY IN BOTSWANA

The results showed that the percentage of persons who experienced moderate or severe food insecurity (SDG indicator 2.1.2) increased to 53.29 percent nationally in 2021/22, from 51.06 percent estimated for 2020/21 and 50.8 percent in 2018/19; whereas the percentage of the population that experienced severe food insecurity increased to 26.16 percent in 2021/22 from 20.16 percent in 2020/21 and 22.20 percent in 2018/19, respectively.




# ELECTRICITY GENERATION & DISTRIBUTION STATS BRIEF, FIRST QUARTER 2023




# GROSS DOMESTIC PRODUCT: FIRST QUARTER OF 2023

In Q1 2023 motor vehicles registered for the first time in Botswana were 7,322, a decrease of 10.8 percent when compared to the previous quarter. Motor vehicle licenses renewals were 123, 201 showing a decrease of 21.7 percent from the previous quarter. The volume of goods transported through rail increased by 18.1 percent in Q1 2023 and a total of P56.6 million in revenue was generated. A total of 12, 214 aircraft movements were recorded with 77.4 percent of them being domestic. In addition, 140,675 air passenger movements were registered, a decrease of 19.0 percent when compared to the previous quarter.

In 2021, the country was at the height of the COVID-19 pandemic, with travel restrictions for inbound travel still in place. This continued to result in a decline in international tourist arrivals, as in the previous year. A total of 543,938 non-citizens arrived in the country in 2021. Out of these, 337,626 (62.1 percent) were international visitors (tourists). This shows a decrease of 5.8 percent (20,599) compared to 358,225 in the previous year. Tourists refer to both overnight and same-day visitors. Overnight visitors accounted for 92.9 percent (313,783) of total visitors, while same-day visitors made up 7.1 percent (23,843) of total visitors. Tourists from South Africa contributed 44.6 percent (150,705), while those from Zimbabwe accounted for 19.2 percent (64,670) of total tourists during the year.



The prevalence of HIV among children aged 0-14 years in Botswana was 0.8%, which corresponds to approximately 5,600 children living with HIV.



Over the years there has been a fluctuating trend in the Maternal Mortality Ratio (MMR) ranging from 127 deaths per 100,000 live births (lowest) in 2015 to 240 deaths per 100,000 live births (highest) in 2021.




# ELECTRICITY GENERATION AND DISTRIBUTION STATS BRIEF, SECOND QUARTER 2023


# TRANSPORT & INFRASTRUCTURE STATS BRIEF Q2 2023

A total of 9,174 motor vehicles were registered for the first time in Botswana in Q2 2023, which was a 25.3 percent increase when compared to Q1 2023.Motor vehicle license renewals in Q2 2023 totalled 134,442, an increase of 9.1 percent from the license renewals of the previous quarter. The volume of goods transported using rail in Q2 2023 amounted to 273,537 net tons, an increase of 7.2 percent compared to the previous quarter.

In Q2 2023 a total of 19,557 aircraft movements were recorded, an increase of 60.1 percent from those recorded in the previous quarter. A total of 194,604 air Passenger movements was recorded in Q2 2023, an increase of 38.3 percent from the number recorded in the previous quarter.

# BOTSWANA CAUSES OF MORTALITY 2020 (HEALTH FACILITY MORTALITY DATA) ANNUAL REPORT

The reports shows that 12,219 deaths were registered in 2020 compared to an estimated 16,214. More than half (51.3 %) of registered deaths occurred in health facilities.

A total of 5,136 deaths were reported in all Health Facilities of Botswana for the year 2020. The highest proportion of registered deaths occurred in Francistown DHMT (22.1%), followed by Gaborone DHMT (16.6%) and Kweneng East DHMT (11.5%). The lowest deaths were recorded from Chobe DHMT (0.7%) followed by North East DHMT (1.0%). Most of the registered deaths were from District Hospitals (41.1%) followed by Referral hospitals (38.3%) and Primary Hospitals (20.6%).

# OUTPATIENT MENTAL HEALTH DISORDERS STATISTICAL BRIEF 2019

Majority of mental health consultations were from Lobatse with 15.1% followed by Francistown with 14.9% and Gaborone (13.4%). 



# NATIONAL ENERGY USE SURVEY STATS BRIEF 2022/23

Paraffin was the least consumed Energy form at an annual consumption of 63.9TJ nationwide, a contribution of 0.2% to National Total Energy consumption.




# NUTRITIONAL STATUS OF CHILDREN UNDER FIVE IN BOTSWANA 2009-2017

Over the same period, prevalence of underweight among the girls decreased to 7.6 percent and 7.0 percent as compared to 11.9 percent recorded in 2009.



The Mining Producer Price Index increased by 3.9 percent, from 122.6 in Quarter 1 of 2023 to 127.4 in Quarter 2 of 2023. The increase was due to a rise in section indices of Gold, Salt and Diamond by 93.3 percent, 18.6 percent and 3.1 percent respectively. Other minerals, specifically Coal and Soda Ash recorded a decrease of 6.6 percent and 3.6 percent respectively.





# PRODUCER PRICE INDEX (MINING AND UTILITIES) QUARTER 3 OF 2023

A decrease of 27.0 percent was recorded for Gold, 24.3 percent for Salt, 22.1 percent for Coal, 17.0 percent for Soda Ash and 11.8 percent for Diamond.





Transport Group was the second contributor (with an annual average inflation rate of 4.2 percent), followed by, Miscellaneous Goods & Services Group (8.7 percent) and Housing, Water, and Electricity. 

# INTERNATIONAL MERCHANDISE TRADE STATISTICS JANUARY-DECEMBER 2023

#### **Periodicity:** Monthly **Published:** January – December 2023

Total Exports in 2023 shrank by 23.8 percent (P24,380.4 million), decreasing from P102,520.4 million in 2022 to P78,139.9 million in 2023. This decline was primarily driven by significant decreases in the exports of diamonds, live cattle, and coal, accounting for 30.6 percent (P27,340.8 million), 47.4 percent (P560.2 million), and 27.8 percent (P179.6 million) respectively. These figures represent a decrease from P89,304 million, P1,183 million, and P645.9 million in 2022 to P61,963.2 million, P622.8 million, and P466.3 million in 2023.

In 2023, Total Imports were valued at P88,15.3 million, having decreased by 11.8 percent (P11,783.3 million) from the P99,898.7 million recorded in 2022. The decline was primarily influenced by decreases in diamonds and fuel, with diamond exports reducing by 51.5 percent (P13,233.5 million) and fuel exports falling by 2.2 percent (P395.3 million) from their respective values of P27,302.5 million and P18,336.8 million in 2022.
