1. Preface

This Stats Brief presents a summary of Transport and Infrastructure Statistics for Quarter 2, 2022. It covers motor vehicle registrations, road, rail and air transport statistics.

A total of 7,727 motor vehicles on first registration was recorded in Q2 2022, a 3.1 percent decline from the previous quarter. Out of these, 79.9 percent were used, 20.0 percent were new and 0.1 percent were rebuilt motor vehicles.

Goods transported through rail increased by 2.8 percent in Q2 2022 and generated P51, 818 million in revenue. Still in this quarter, a total of 17,902 aircraft movements were recorded with 20.7 percent of them being international and 79.3 percent being domestic. Air passenger movements in the quarter registered an increase of 76.9 percent from Q1 2022.

A total of 77,151 people crossed Kazungula bridge in Q2 2022, showing an increase of 47.5 percent from what was recorded in the previous quarter. Non – citizens constituted 89.2 percent of total movement on the bridge.


2. Motor Vehicle Registration

2.1 Motor Vehicles on First Registration

In this quarter, a total of 7,727 motor vehicles on first registration was recorded. This was a fall of 3.1 percent from the 7,974 registered in the previous quarter.

Passenger cars constituted 72.9 percent of motor vehicles on first registration, followed by vans at 8.8 percent. Motor cycles at 0.8 percent, made up the least number of those on first registration, see [Table 1](#) in [Appendix 1](#) and [Figure 1](#) below.

Used vehicles, at 79.9 percent, made up the majority of motor vehicles on first registration. Brand new and rebuilt ones constituted 20.0 and 0.1 percent respectively, see [Table 2](#) in [Appendix 1](#).

Vehicles originating from Japan accounted for 69.7 percent of total motor vehicles on first registration. South African vehicles constituted 20.2 percent of total motor vehicles followed by those originating from within Botswana at 5.0 percent, see [Table 3](#) in [Appendix 1](#).

Toyota brand vehicles, though having declined by 17.0 percent in the quarter, were the majority among the first registrations and constituted 27.2 percent of the total. Mazda brand followed with 13.5 percent (see [Table 4](#) in [Appendix 1](#)).

The month of June recorded the highest number of first registrations in this quarter, with 36.2 percent of the total. April and May constituted 32.4 and 31.4 percent of the total respectively, refer to [Table 5](#) in [Appendix 1](#).

During the quarter under review, motor vehicles on first registration were recorded more in Gaborone, at 61.4 percent of the total. Francistown and Lobatse recorded 10.2 and 6.8 percent respectively, see [Table 6](#) in [Appendix 1](#).

2.2 Motor Vehicle License Renewals


During this quarter, a total of 133,964 motor vehicle licenses were renewed, indicating an increase of 9.9 percent from the previous quarter. The majority of license renewals were done in June which had 36.5 percent of the total. April and May registered 30.3 and 33.2 percent of the license renewals respectively, see [Tables 7](#) and [8](#) in [Appendix 1](#).

License renewals for Toyota motor vehicles accounted for 49.4 percent of total motor vehicle license renewals, of which 63.8 percent were for passenger cars. Toyota license renewals were followed by Honda ones with 9.7 percent. Mazda and Nissan motor vehicle license renewals accounted for 8.6 and 7.5 percent of the total respectively, see [Table 9](#) in [Appendix 1](#).

3. Kazungula Bridge Border Movement

A total of 77,151 people used Kazungula Bridge in Q2 2022. This was an increase of 47.5 percent from 52,320 people recorded in the previous quarter. Arrivals constituted 52.5 percent of total movements on the bridge while departures made up 47.5 percent of the total. Non-citizens made up 89.2 percent of the arrivals and 87.4 percent of the departures, see **Table 10** in **Appendix 2** and **Figure 2** below.

4. Rail Transport

4.1 Goods Traffic

A volume of 235,051 net tonnes of goods was transported through the railway in Q2 2022 compared to 228,597 in Q1 2022. This was an increase of 2.8 percent. Total exports constituted 41.8 percent of the total, of which 72.7 percent were exports to the South and 27.3 percent to the north. Total imports made up 24.2 percent of goods transported through the railway whilst transit traffic constituted 17.8 percent, see **Table 11** in **Appendix 3**.

4.2 Revenue

Revenue generated from the transportation of goods through railway amounted to P51, 818, 000, which was an increase of 19.5 percent from the amount generated in the previous quarter. Exports and imports generated 43.7 percent and 22.3 percent of total revenue respectively. Revenue generated during the month of June constituted 39.9 percent of the total revenue while April and May accounted for 32.0 and 28.1 percent respectively, see **Table 12** in **Appendix 3**.

5. Air Transport

5.1 Aircraft Movements

Q2 2022 experienced an increase in aircraft movements of over 100 percent after registering 17,902 movements from 8,802 in Q1 2022. International aircraft movements made up 20.7 percent of these movements while 79.3 percent were domestic. This is as shown in [Table 13 in Appendix 4](#).

Non-scheduled aircraft arrivals accounted for 38.4 percent of total aircraft movements while the non-scheduled departures made up 38.0 percent. Both private departures and private arrivals recorded the least with 1.3 percent of total movements each, see [Table 14 in Appendix 4](#).


Maun airport received 66.8 percent of total aircraft movements, followed by Kasane International airport with 15.8 percent. Sir Seretse Khama International and Francistown airports had 14.8 percent and 2.1 percent of the total aircraft movements respectively, see [Table 15 in Appendix 4](#).

5.2 Air Passenger Movements

A total of 172,890 passenger movements were recorded during Q2 2022, an increase of 76.9 percent when compared to the previous quarter. Both international and domestic passenger movements recorded increases, at 66.3 and 90.0 percent respectively, see [Table 16 in Appendix 4](#).

Scheduled air passenger movements constituted 71.5 percent of the total air passenger movements recorded in this quarter. This was an increase of 58.5 percent when compared to the previous quarter. Non-scheduled movements accounted for 26.5 percent of the total. Private and scenic passenger movements constituted 0.5 and 1.5 percent of the total respectively, see [Table 17 in Appendix 4](#) and [Figure 3](#) below.

Sir Seretse Khama International airport recorded the largest number of air passenger movements compared to other airports. It accounted for 44.1 percent of the total followed by Maun airport with 38.5 percent. Maun and Kasane airports were the only airports with scenic flights, and they had 98.5 and 1.5 percent of those flights respectively, see [Table 18 in Appendix 4](#).

Explanatory Notes

1. Motor Vehicle Registrations

Motor vehicle registration deals with licensing of motor vehicles with respect to those registered for the first time and license renewal of pre-existing ones. First registrations are done at the Department of Road Transport and Safety (DRTS) only, while renewals are done at DRTS offices, Post Offices country wide and some stores like Sefalana Cash and Carry. First Registration could be new, used or rebuilt.

2. Rail Transport

Rail Transport covers passengers and goods transported by rail and the revenue generated from the conveyance of these goods and passengers. Botswana Origin is comprised of Total Exports and Local Traffic goods while Botswana Total is an addition of Total Imports and Botswana Origin goods. Total Traffic is made up of Total Exports, Total Imports, Local Traffic and Transit Traffic. Local traffic is goods transported within Botswana and Transit Traffic is goods transported through Botswana to other countries.

3. Kazungula Bridge

Kazungula Bridge is used to connect Botswana to countries in the north, mainly Angola, Democratic Republic of Congo (DRC), Zambia and Zimbabwe. Previously a pontoon was used at the ferry. The bridge started operating in May of 2021.

4. Air Transport

Air transport section covers the movement of aircrafts and air passengers both locally and internationally.

International movements refer to movements made by aircrafts and passengers to destinations outside Botswana whilst domestic movements account for travels made within Botswana. The movements are further categorized into scheduled, non-scheduled and private.

Scheduled aircraft movements refer to commercial airlines operating on a time table while non-scheduled aircraft movements refer to commercial aircrafts which operate as and when needed. Private aircraft movements refer to non-commercial individual aircrafts. Scenic aircraft movements refer to airlines that focus on wildlife and surrounding natures.

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
