



Household

The census considers your residential address to be your household. A household consists of one or more persons, related or unrelated, living together "under the same roof" in the same lolwapa/dwelling, eating together "from the same pot" and/or making common provision for food and other living arrangements.











Relationship

The question on relationship to the head of the household is important in determining people's living patterns, household composition, i.e., extended or nuclear type of families. The relationship should be recorded in relation to the head of household and not the other way round.









Citizenship

It is very important to collect data on citizenship in a census because it distinguishes citizens of a particular country from foreign citizens. Illegal immigrants are also covered.













Place of Birth

The concept of place of birth in a census refers to the geographic place where the mother of the individual resided most of the time at the time of the person's birth.













Parental Survivorship

The questions on parental survivorship are used in determining orphan-hood among children aged less than 18 years and the indirect estimation of adult mortality.





Marital Status

The question on marital status is asked of all persons 10 years and over. The categories are married, never married, living together, separated, divorced, widowed, divorced but living together and widowed but living together.











Fertility and Child Survival

This question is for females only who are of the age of 10 years and over. Categories include children born in the last 12 months and last child born alive.











Household Access to ICT















Disability

The question here is for those who are 5 years and over. The disability categories include the following: seeing, hearing, communicating, walking, self-care and remembering.













Principal fuel

Here we record the main source of energy used by the household for cooking, heating, lighting, heating space and heating water.













Housing Unit

The questions on this category are about water supply, type of toilet, bathroom, and kitchen used in the household. The questions also establish how the household disposes waste (refuse disposal).













Agriculture and Land Acquisition

These questions basically want to find out whether members of the household are rearing animals such as cattle, goats, donkeys, sheep, ostrich and pigs. It also ask about crops which the household plant as well as the land tenure system used for ploughing such crops.











Mortality

The question seeks to find out household members who have died, causes of death as well as finding out if there has been a maternal death in the household.













Economic Activity

The reference period for current economic activity is the seven (7) days preceding the census night. Questions on economic activity are intended to capture the proportion of the total population who are economically active and types of activities they are engaged in.
