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Preface

This International Merchandise Trade Statistics (IMTS) Monthly Digest presents statistics on Botswana's total imports and exports of goods as at the end of March 2013. Data for Imports and exports of goods is currently complete up to February 2013. Data for March 2013 is from borders with automated facilities only, constituting 98 percent of total trade in value terms.

This is the fifth monthly digest produced in 2013, and entails summaries of Total Merchandise Trade from the first quarter of 2007 to March 2013 as presented on **Table 1**. Trade by Principal Commodity groups is presented on **Tables 2.1** and **2.2** for imports and exports, respectively, giving data from the first quarter of 2008 to March 2013. Direction of Trade is given for the most recent twelve months and this appears on **Tables 3.1** and **3.2** for imports and exports respectively.

Three graphical presentations appear in this digest. **Chart 1** shows imports, total exports and trade balance from January 2005 to March 2013 while **Charts 2.1 and 2.2** details Principal Commodity groups for major imports and major exports respectively, for March 2013 only.

Statistics on commodities that were mostly traded during the most recent two months, February and March 2013 in this case, appear on **Tables 4.1 (A) & (B)** for imports while exports are presented on **Tables 4.2 (A) & (B)** for the same months. Trade at Chapter Level (2 digits Harmonized Commodity Description & Coding System) appears on **Table 5**, presenting data for February and March 2013.

Table 1 distinguishes Domestic Exports from Re-Exports while the other tables give Total Exports, which is the sum of the two.

We sincerely thank all stakeholders involved in the formulation of this monthly digest, their continued support and feedback, as we strive to better serve Batswana and all other important users of our services.

1.0 Total Trade

Total merchandise trade as presented in this section refers to imports, domestic exports (exports of Botswana origin) and re-exports (goods which were exported in the same condition as imported or after undergoing minor transformation which leaves them not substantially changed) as well as trade balance, which is the difference between total exports and imports.

Since Statistics Botswana receives new data on monthly basis, and there is continuous data editing as various tables and reports are produced, the database is therefore updated from time to time. As a result of editing, revision of data on previous Monthly Digests (for subsequent months) and that on the current Monthly Digest may differ. Discussions on total trade (Section 1) are based on **Table 1**.

1.1 Imports

Table 1 has been modified to give imports at cost price, freight and insurance charges separately, as well as cost, freight and insurance (cif). Discussions on imports are however, based on cost, freight and insurance (cif) value. March 2013 total imports (cif) were valued at P5, 188.0 million, showing an increase of 3.3 percent (P166.9 million) from the February 2013 value of P5, 021.1 million. In comparison to the March 2012 total imports which recorded P4, 722.0 million, the March 2013 value increased by 9.9 percent (P466.0 million).

1.2 Total Exports

In March 2013 total exports were valued at P6, 199.6 million, having increased by 16.9 percent (P894.0 million) from the February 2013 value of P5, 305.6 million. The March 2013 total exports increased by slightly over a 100 percent (P3, 113.0 million) from the total value of exports realised in March 2012, which stood at P3, 086.6 million.

1.3 Trade Balance

March 2013 recorded a trade surplus of P1, 011.6 million. This follows another trade surplus of P284.5 million recorded in February 2013.




Chart 1: Total Merchandise Trade - January 2005 to March 2013 (Million PULA)

Even though **Chart 1** shows a significant trade surplus for March 2013, which is subsequent to another surplus realised in February 2013, it should be noted that trade balance is purely dependent on the value of diamonds traded. Since there are imports and exports of diamonds in Botswana, trade balance during any particular month is dependent on which flow of trade (imports/exports) has recorded a higher value.

2.0 Trade by Principal Commodities

Principal commodity groups refer to selections of related commodities grouped together to form major groups. Commodities forming a group may be of related chapters, for example; "Machinery & Electrical Equipment" which combines machines and electrical appliances; "Vehicles & Transport Equipment" which combines vehicles and other equipment used for transport purposes.

In some cases it becomes challenging to come up with further groups of related chapters or commodities. This prevails when commodity groupings' contributions to the total, remain minimal. In such cases, the commodities are grouped together under the general category coined "Other".


2.1 Principal Imports

Imports by Principal Commodity Groups together with the associated percentage distributions, appear on **Table 2.1**, covering the first quarter of 2008 to March 2013. Percentage distributions are however only shown for 2010, 2011 and 2012 totals, as well as for February and March 2013. **Chart 2.1** gives graphical presentation of Principal Import Commodity groups for March 2013 only.

Composition of imports by principal commodities for March 2013 shows that Diamonds contributed 32.1 percent (P1, 664.6 million) to total imports (P5, 188.0 million) during the month, followed by Fuel with 18.4 percent (P956.8 million). Machinery & Electrical Equipment contributed 10.4 percent (P540.8 million) followed by Food, Beverages & Tobacco and Chemicals & Rubber Products, with 9.3 percent (P484.6 million) and 8.2 percent (P427.7 million) respectively. Vehicles & Transport Equipment contributed 6.6 percent (P339.9 million).

Percentage distributions for other import groups can be observed on **Table 2.1**, while **Chart 2.1** displays percentage distributions for March 2013 only.

2.2 Principal Exports

March 2013 total exports were valued at P6, 199.6 million, with 85.4 percent (P5, 292.3 million) attributed to *Diamond* exports. The diamond trade is for both rough and polished diamonds and **Table 2.3** gives trade in diamonds at a disaggregated level from the 1st Quarter 2008 to March 2013.

Copper/Nickel exports and Machinery & Electrical Equipment (mainly re-exports) contributed 7.1 percent (P438.4 million) and 2.1 percent (P130.2 million) respectively, while Meat & Meat Products contributed 1.1 percent (P66.4 million) to total exports during the month under review.

Percentage distributions for other export groups can be observed on **Table 2.2** while **Chart 2.2** gives the graphical presentation of the extract from this table, for March 2013 only. It should however be noted that total exports discussed here are the sum of domestic exports and re-exports.

Total exports as presented in **Table 2.2** should be understood to mean the value placed on the consignment by the exporter as at the time the consignment crosses the border of the exporting country. This value may not be the same as what is finally received by the exporter in respect of the consignment, taking into account issues of time lag between the date the consignment left the exporting country and the time sales were actually made, as well as exchange rates at the time the consignment crossed the border and the time of sale.


Some goods like Copper/Nickel may be sold after some refinements have been made; for example exporting Copper/Nickel Matte and receiving values of refined Copper & Nickel sales. The consignment that crosses the border of the exporting country in March, for example, may not all be sold during that particular month. As a result there may always be some leftovers and brought forwards that will bring differences between the value of the consignment as it crossed the border of the exporting country during a particular month and the actual sales made during that same month.

Statistics Botswana compiles international merchandise trade statistics using the United Nations Statistics Division Guidelines, whereby foreign trade is recorded as at the time the consignment crosses the border whereas Bank of Botswana compiles Balance of Payments from actual receipts in respect of sales made on exported commodities. Users can expect differences in figures reported by Statistics Botswana (*Table 2.2*) and those reported by Bank of Botswana (*Botswana Financial Statistics; Table 6.3*). This is because the two reports may not necessarily be reporting on the same consignment, even though the same variable names and period of reporting are used.

Users need to note that the values reported by Statistics Botswana are estimates made by exporters as at the time goods are dispatched, whether there is change of ownership or not, while those reported by Bank of Botswana are actual payments received by exporters for sales made during a particular period (change of ownership has occurred in this case). As a result, these two values, though using the same variable names and the same period of reporting, are not necessarily values for the same consignment. The Statistics Botswana value is for the consignment that crossed the border during a particular period while the Bank of Botswana value is for sales that were made during that period.

Bank of Botswana value takes into account change of ownership while compilation of foreign trade statistics is concerned with whether goods have crossed borders of trading partners, regardless of whether there is change of ownership or not.

3.0 Trade by Regional and Major Partners

Direction of trade is presented on this section, giving imports by source while exports are presented by destination. Only major trading partners are considered individually, while smaller trading partners are grouped together under a general category. Data for the most recent twelve months appear on **Table 3.1** for imports and **Table 3.2** for exports. Monthly data is currently from April 2012 to March 2013.

Trade is presented at country level for trading partners having significant trade with Botswana while others whose trade is not much, are grouped together under one general category per region, for example, "Rest of Africa" or "Others".

3.1 Imports by Region and Major Trading Partners

Imports for March 2013 were valued at P5, 188.0 million, with 59.5 percent (P3, 088.6 million) coming from South Africa while Namibia supplied 12.6 percent (P655.1 million). The European Union (EU) supplied imports valued at P1, 075.7 million during March 2013, representing 20.7 percent of total imports. Imports from Belgium and the United Kingdom represented 14.4 percent (P747.9 million) and 4.5 percent (P234.3 million) respectively, of total imports from the EU during the month under review.

Imports from Asia were valued at P267.8 million in March 2013, representing 5.2 percent of total imports. The major suppliers of imports from Asia were Israel and China with 2.1 percent (P107.3 million) and 1.0 percent (P54.0 million) respectively.

Imports from the United States of America were valued at P31.2 million in March 2013, which is just under 1.0 percent of total imports during the month.

Imports at regional and country level (for selected countries) are presented on **Table 3.1**; however, percentage distributions do not form part of this table.

3.2 Exports by Region and Major Partner Countries

Total exports for March 2013 were valued at P6, 199.6 million, with 13.1 percent (P810.4 million) of this value destined to SADC. South Africa received 8.7 percent (P542.2 million), Namibia 2.5 percent (P152.2 million) while Zimbabwe got 1.4 percent (P89.5 million) of total exports for the month under review.

Exports destined to the European Union (EU) were valued at P4, 489.8 million, representing 72.4 percent of total exports in March 2013. The United Kingdom and Belgium received 65.6 percent (P4, 066.2 million) and 5.7 percent (P353.0 million) respectively, of total exports from the EU in March 2013.

In March 2013, Asia received exports valued at P441.3 million, which is 7.1 percent of total exports. Israel and India contributed greatly to Asia bound exports, with 3.3 percent (P202.7 million) and 1.8 percent (P108.7 million) respectively.

Exports to Norway were valued at P328.2 million, representing 5.3 percent whereas Switzerland received 1.7 percent (P102.3 million) of total exports during March 2013.

Other destinations for exports can be observed on **Table 3.2**; however, percentage distributions do not form part of the table.

4.0 Most Traded Commodities

This section presents the top most traded commodities during February and March 2013. **Table 4.1 (A)** and **Table 4.1 (B)** present the top 100 imported commodities in February and March 2013 respectively.

The top 50 exported commodities constitute over 90 percent of total exports every month. Data on the top 50 exported commodities during February and March 2013 is presented on **Tables 4.2 (A)** and **(B)** respectively, for the two months while **Table 5** presents trade at Chapter level during February and March 2013.

6.0 Technical Notes

Botswana International Merchandise Trade Statistics are compiled by International Merchandise Trade Statistics Section of Statistics Botswana. External trade statistics here refers to trade in goods only (International Merchandise Trade Statistics). Trade statistics in services are not compiled by this unit. The primary source of External Trade data is Customs & Excise Division which is part of Botswana Unified Revenue Service. Customs is responsible for data capture for both computerized and manual borders and the monthly raw data files are transferred to Statistics Botswana for data processing, in electronic form.

Up to April 2009 Monthly Digest, Botswana was practicing Relaxed Special Trade Type. The Relaxed Special Trade Type takes in to account goods that are exported or imported for inward or outward customs processing while the Strict Special Trade Type does not include the same.

In June 2009, the Botswana External Trade database was revised to cater for General Trade Type as per the United Nations Statistics Division recommendations. The General Trade Type gives a complete coverage of External Trade as compared to the Special Trade Type.

Imports are valued CIF (cost, insurance & freight) while exports are valued FOB (free on board). The value of imports includes transport and insurance costs to the importing country. Exports value consists only of the value of goods as they leave the exporting country. Goods are valued as at the time they cross the border of the exporting country.

6.1 Definitions used

Domestic exports: Goods of Botswana origin being exported permanently out of Botswana for consumption in the outside world.

Re-Exports: Goods that were initially imported into Botswana for local consumption, but are now being exported permanently out of the country for reasons best known to individual exporters.

Imports: Goods imported from the outside world, into Botswana for local consumption.

Trade Balance (Net Export): This refers to the total value of goods exported minus the total value of goods imported by a given economy in a given period of time. A positive trade balance (trade surplus) indicates that a country is exporting more in value terms than it is importing. A negative trade balance (trade deficit) indicates that the country importing more than it is exporting.
