1. INTRODUCTION

This Stats Brief presents a summary of the latest Transport and Infrastructure Statistics for Quarter 3, 2020. It covers statistics relating to Air Transport, Motor Vehicle Registrations, Railway and Water Transport.

Air Transport section deals with aircraft and air passenger movements while the section on Motor Vehicle Registrations comprises of motor vehicle first registrations and license renewals. Railway Transport covers statistics on quantity of goods carried by rail and revenue generated from the conveyance of the said goods. Water transport shows the movement of vehicles and passengers across the Zambezi River through the Pontoon to and from Zambia, Angola and the Democratic Republic of Congo.

In Q3 2020, aircraft movements stood at 2,664, showing an increase of 91.9 percent from 1,388 recorded in the previous quarter.

The quarter also realized an increase of 21.4 percent in the volume of goods transported through rail. A total of P66.8 million in revenue was generated from the process, resulting in an increase of 20.5 percent from P55.4 million generated in the previous quarter.

Pontoon Passengers increased from 6,830 in Q2 2020 to 10,862 in Q3 2020, registering an increase of 59.0 percent. Vehicles transported by the Pontoon increased in Q3 2020 by 42.5 percent from 7,026 in Q2 2020 to 10,013.

In Q3 2020, 11,818 motor vehicles were registered for the first time while only 5,281 were registered in the previous quarter. Out of this total, 80.1 percent were used vehicles, 19.9 percent were new, while 0.1 percent were rebuilt. Sixty nine point four percent (69.4) of the firstly registered motor vehicles were imported from Japan while 19.9 percent were from South Africa.

2. Air Transport

Air transport section deals with the movement of aircrafts and air passengers both locally and internationally. International movements herein refers to movements made by aircrafts and passengers to destinations outside Botswana, whilst domestic movements accounts for travels made within Botswana. The movements are further categorized into scheduled, non-scheduled and private. Scheduled aircraft movements refer to commercial airlines operating on a time table while non-scheduled aircraft movements refer to commercial aircrafts which operate as and when needed. Private aircraft movements refer to non-commercial individual aircrafts. Scenic aircraft movements refer to airlines that focus on wildlife and surrounding natures.

2.1 Aircraft Movements.

A total of 2,664 aircraft movements were recorded in Q3 2020, which was a 91.9 percent increase from aircraft movements recorded in Q2 2020. Domestic movements constituted 86.0 percent of total aircraft movements while 14.0 percent were international. See **Table 1** and **Figure 1**.

Figure 1: International and Domestic Aircraft Movements by Quarter, 2018 – Q3 2020



2.1.1. Aircraft Movements by Type of Flight

Non-scheduled aircraft movements accounted for 78.4 percent of the total aircraft movements recorded in Q3 2020. Scheduled movements followed with 8.4 percent while scenic and private movements constituted 8.1 and 5.1 percent respectively. Compared to Q2 2020, all types of movements realised increases. See **Table 2**

Non-scheduled movements dominated in domestic aircraft movements in Q3 2020. They, constituted 75.5 percent of the total. Non-scheduled departures accounted for 38.4 percent of domestic movements while non-scheduled arrivals constituted 37.2 percent. See **Table 3**.

2.1.2 Aircraft Movements by Airport and Month


Most of the aircraft movements in Q3 2020 were recorded during September, constituting 41.7 percent. August and July recorded 29.8 percent and 28.5 percent of the total respectively. Maun was the busiest airport with 62.1 percent of total aircraft movements. Sir Seretse Khama International Airport followed with 29.4 percent. See **Table 4** and **Figure 2**

2.1.3 Aircraft Movements by Airport and Type of Movement

In Q3 2020, most of international movements were recorded at Sir Seretse Khama International Airport, at 80.5 percent of total international movements. Maun airport handled mostly domestic movements and they accounted for 70.1 percent of the total domestic movements. See **Table 5**.

2.2 Air Passenger Movements

A total of 14,699 air passenger movements were recorded in Q3 2020. Both international and domestic air passenger movements increased in Q3 2020 after a drastic reduction in Q2 2020. International air passenger movements increased from 826 in Q2 2020 to 1,541 in Q3 2020, while domestic air passenger movements increased to 13,158 in Q3 2020 from 1,878 in Q2 2020. See **Table 6**.

2.2.1 Air Passenger Movements by Quarter and Type of Flight

Scheduled passenger movements accounted for 53.8 percent of total passenger movements. Non-scheduled movements accounted for 41.4 percent of total movements while private and scenic movements accounted for 2.0 and 2.9 percent respectively. See **Table 7**

2.2.2 Air Passenger Movements by Airport

Maun airport handled most of the passenger traffic. It accounted for 53.7 percent followed by Sir Seretse Khama International Airport (SSKIA) with 38.6 percent. In addition, Maun recorded mostly domestic passenger movements (58.7 percent of total domestic passenger movements), while Sir Seretse Khama International Airport recorded mostly international passengers movements (88.9 percent of total international passenger movements). This is as shown in **Table 8**



3. Rail Transport

Rail Transport covers passengers and goods transported by rail and the revenue generated from the conveyance of these goods and passengers. Botswana Origin is comprised of Total Exports and Local Traffic goods while Botswana Total is an addition of Total Imports and Botswana Origin goods. Total Traffic is made up of Total Exports, Total Imports, Local Traffic and Transit Traffic. Local traffic is goods transported within Botswana and Transit Traffic is goods transported through Botswana to other countries.

3.1 Goods Traffic

A total of 327,447 net tonnes of goods were transported using rail during the quarter under review, which was an increase of 21.4 percent from 269,751 transported in the previous quarter. Imported rail goods increased by 56.5 percent while exported rail goods increased by 34.5 percent compared to the previous quarter. See **Table 10** and **Figure 4** below.

4. Water Transport

Kazungula Ferry is used for the transportation of both goods and passengers to and from countries in the north of Botswana, mainly Angola, Democratic Republic of Congo (DRC), Zambia and Zimbabwe.

4.1 Pontoon Passengers


A total of 10,862 pontoon passengers were recorded during Q3 2020 and 39.5 percent of them were arriving into the country while 60.5 percent were departing. An increase in the number of passengers (59.0 percent) was realised this quarter when compared to the previous quarter. Adult males made up 94.6 percent of total arrivals and 96.6 percent of the departures. See **Table 15** and **Figure 5**

The pontoon was mostly used by Zambian nationals, they accounted for 64.9 percent of the total pontoon passengers and 97.6 percent of these were males. A total of 611 Batswana used the pontoon which was 5.6 percent of the total passengers, of which 64.3 percent were arrivals whilst 35.7 percent were departures. Zimbabweans and South Africans made up 14.6 and 7.7 percent of the total pontoon passengers respectively. See **Table 16**.

4.2 Vehicles Carried by Pontoon

5. Motor Vehicle Registration

This part deals with licensing of motor vehicles with respect to those registered for the first time and the renewal of pre-existing ones. First registrations are done at the Department of Road Transport and Safety (DRTS) only, while renewals are done at DRTS offices, Post Offices country wide and some stores like Sefalana Cash and Carry.

5.1 Motor Vehicle First Registrations

This section looks at vehicles that were registered for the first time. These vehicles could be new, used or rebuilt.

5.1.1 Motor Vehicle First Registrations by Quarter & Type

A total of 11,818 motor vehicle first registrations were recorded in Q3 2020 and 72.1 percent of them were passenger cars. Motor vehicle first registrations in Q3 2020 increased by 123.8 percent from 5,281 registered in the previous quarter. See **Table 19**.

5.1.2 Motor Vehicle First Registrations by Vehicle Type



Most of the vehicles registered this quarter (69.4 percent) were from Japan, followed by South Africa with 19.9 percent. Most of the vehicles from Japan were used, accounting for 99.6 percent of vehicles from Japan. 5.2.2 Motor Vehicle License Renewals by Month



5.2.3 Motor Vehicle License Renewals by Make

In Q3 2020, 46.2 percent of motor vehicle license renewals were for Toyota motor vehicles. These were followed by those of Mazda and Nissan at 7.5 and 7.0 percent respectively. Honda accounted for 6.7 percent of total license renewals. Massey Ferguson was the most renewed tractor license with 52.5 percent. Ford and Mahindra tractors accounted for 12.3 and 0.4 percent of total tractor license renewals. See **Tables 27**.
