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MULTI-TOPIC SURVEY QUARTER 4, 2021 LABOUR FORCE MODULE REPORT

Preface

This is the 5th Labour force report from the Quarterly Multi-Topic Survey (QMTS). The QMTS is multi modular survey intended to provide more frequent indictors for planning and decision making. The QMTS primary module is the labour force one. Other modules are included on rotational basis in different quarters as per stakeholder and user needs.

The first QMTS was conducted in quarter three (July-September) of 2019, whose results were published in January 2020. This was followed by the reports for the fourth quarter of 2019, the first quarter of 2020 and the fourth quarter of 2020. The complete round of the quarterly survey was supposed to be completed in the quarters of 2020 and 2021, to allow for the computation of annualized labour indicators covering the four seasons of a year. This however, was not possible due to the outbreak of COVID-19 and subsequent lockdown(s).

This report presents results for data collected in the fourth quarter (October to December) of 2021. It presents information on employment, unemployment, wages from the formal sector, youth employment and unemployment, disability employment and other labour force indicators. Included in the report is the impact of COVID-19 on employment and household enterprises.

It is important to note that results of quarterly surveys are almost always subject to seasonal variations. This survey is no exception and thus the results that will be obtained over the four quarters of any year will have a seasonal effect. Assessment of the results for long term trends would be better done through analysis of year on year quarterly changes. Statistics Botswana has once again, as it did in the conduct of the more extensive 2015/16 Botswana Multi-Topic Household Survey (BMTHS), collaborated with the World Bank in the planning and conduct of this survey. We are grateful for its invaluable technical guidance and support. We are also grateful for the advice and guidance given by other National Statistics Offices in Africa through the consultations that were done.

Statistics Botswana will continue to engage stakeholders on the content of this publication to ensure that it responds to their needs and also invite them to participate in analysis of modules which shall be covered on a rotational basis.

I hope you find this publication informative and useful for monitoring and decision making.

Summary Headline Labour Force Indicators

This is the fifth report of the labour force module from the quarterly multi topic survey (QMTS). The COVID-19 outbreak meant that data collection could not be undertaken for other quarters of 2021. Readers are advised to note that results of quarterly surveys have a seasonal variation component and comparison with immediate previous results of the surveys in a calendar year should be done taking into account this seasonal variation.

The Labour Force Module of the Quarterly Multi Topic Survey (QMTS) includes several sections of interest that provide useful indicators which are tracked on a quarterly basis to continually monitor change in the labour force market, on the supply side. It is hoped this set of indicators will inform policy formulation, targeted programming and interventions and monitoring of the labour market by stakeholders and government.

Table 1.0 provides headline indicators that would assist in monitoring the progress being made in employment and job creation. The table presents the total labour force, persons employed, unemployment and employment by sex and the resultant indicators.

A trend of QMTS labour force module indicators for quarters four 2019, 2020 and 2021 (excluding quarters for which data collection could not be undertaken,) are presented in the summary Table 1.0. It is worth noting that when comparison is being made between seasonally different quarters of a calendar year, indicators could be affected by seasonality.

The Employed population (15 years and above) recorded a decline of 2.2 percent between quarters four (4) 2020 and four (4) of 2021, from 733,875 to 717,418 persons. This was accompanied by an increase of 5.7 percent of unemployed persons, from 238,731 to 252,316 persons over the period.

Formal sector employment went up from 477,716 in quarter four of 2020 to 494,457 in quarter four of 2021, an increase of 3.5 percent.

The youth labour force decreased by 4.4 percent between quarter four 2020 and four of 2021, from 509,195 to 486,706. Youth unemployment rate went up by 2.0 percentage point over the period, from 32.4 to 34.4 percent.

Unemployment rate (persons aged 15 years and above) went up by 1.5 percentage points, from 24.5 percent in fourth of 2020, to 26.0 percent in fourth quarter of 2021.

The Youth not in Education, not in Employment or Training (NEET Rate %) went up from 37.5 to 39.4 percent between the two periods, an increase of 1.9 percentage points.

1.0 Introduction

Statistics Botswana started data collection for the Quarterly Multi-Topic Survey (QMTS) in July 2019. The first three (3) consecutive quarterly labour force module reports were for quarters three and four of 2019 and quarter one of 2020. Data collection for quarters two (2) and three (3) of 2020 was not undertaken due to restricted population movement due to COVID19 pandemic, which abated in the fourth quarter of 2020, allowing for data collection and production of the labour force report for the fourth quarter of 2020. The last QMTS labour force module report produced was for the fourth quarter of 2020, which was published in February 2021.

The aim of QMTS is to produce timely quarterly estimates on Labour Force and other key indicators for development frameworks, as will be informed by national priorities and stakeholder needs.

This report presents results from the Labour Force module of the QMTS quarter four of 2021, covering the months of October to December 2021. Included along with the labour force module is a module on the impact of COVID-19 on employment and self-employment, as well as impact on informal enterprises.

The QMTS collected data on Labour Force activities adhering to the 19th International Conference for Labour Statisticians resolutions of 2013. One of the key resolutions is that persons are considered employed only if they work for payment and/or profit gain. This implies that persons engaged in subsistence farming are not considered to be in employment. Activities of producing goods & services mainly for own final use by household are not included under employment.

Objectives of Survey

The primary objective of the QMTS is to provide a comprehensive set of indicators for labour market and other indicators as guided by stakeholder needs and national priorities. The set of indicators derived from the QMTS are intended to support Labour Market indicators required for the Labour Market Information System (LMIS) set up by the Human Resource Development Council, and the National Monitoring and Evaluation System (NMES), on a regular basis.

The plan is to conduct the QMTS continually, every quarter, to provide indicators for Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs), Vision 2036, National Development Plan 11 (NDP11) (and subsequent NDPs), and Africa Agenda 2063.

This will be achieved by rotating modules on topics as required by stakeholders. To that end, QMTS started with a total of 12 modules, being;

Demographic Characteristics Disability Education Labour Own Production Sources of household income Safety Nets Housing Non-farm enterprises Subjective welfare FIES ICT- household questionnaire

1.2 Scope of Analysis

The results presented in this report cover current economic activities for the population aged 15 years and above. These are persons who are currently employed, and those who are actively seeking work. Included in the currently employed persons are those who did some work for at least one (1) hour in the past seven (7) days. The actively seeking work persons are those who, in the past 30 days, made effort(s) to search for work or start a business. Labour force comprises of individuals who are currently employed, and those actively seeking work (unemployed).

The choice of target population (15 years and above) is based on the International Labour Organization (ILO) convention no. 138, which stipulates that minimum age for employment should not be less than 15 years. However countries with less developed economic or educational infrastructure may set the minimum age at 14 years. Botswana has set employment minimum age at 14 years according to the Employment Act Chapter 47:01. The Employment Act Section 107 (2) states that "A child who has attained the age of 14 years and is not attending school may be employed on light work not harmful to his/her health and development". In addition, the country has ratified the ILO convention no. 182 on eliminating the worst forms of child labour.

However, Botswana's economic and education infrastructure has developed over the years, to an extent that there is compelling argument for the economic activity target population to cover persons aged 18 years and above, considering that persons below 18 years should be, or are still pursuing their education.

To adhere to international standards (ILO), and satisfy national planning needs, this brief provides, for some indicators like unemployment rate, indicators for both 15 & 18 years and above target populations. The analysis is focused on the target population of 15 years and above.

1.2.1 The Employed Population

The employed population comprises all persons of working age, who, during a specified brief period of one (1) week or one (1) day, were in the following categories:

- Paid employment (whether at work or with a job but not at work; or
- Self-employment (whether at work or with an enterprise but not at work)

The concept "at work" refers to persons who, during the reference period performed some work for wage or salary, in cash or in kind *(for paid employment)*. Or persons who during the reference period performed some work for profit or family gain, in cash or in kind *(for self-employment)*. Persons who did some work in the reference period includes those who worked for at least one (1) hour for payment/profit.

1.2.2 The Unemployed Population

The unemployed persons or population refers to all persons aged 15 years and above, whom during a specified reference period (30 days) were seeking and also being available for work, or start a business. This is a category which covers persons who are ready to supply labour for the production of goods and services, but they are still seeking where to supply the labour.

Generally Unemployed persons are defined as working age persons who were:

- 1. Not employed in past seven 7 days / reference week
- 2. Carried out activities to seek employment or start a business in past 30 days / reference month
- 3. Available to start job/business in reference week OR in short period

1.2.3 Population Outside Labour Force (Economically Inactive)

The Population outside the Labour Force comprises of all persons who were neither "employed" nor "unemployed" during the short reference period (7 days), used to measure "current activity". This population is split into four groups:

- Attendant at educational institutions;
- Retired;
- -Engaged in family duties;
- Other economically inactive

The Economically Inactive Population are not part of the supply of labour but are important as they are potential labour supply in the future.

2.0 Labour Force Results

The results presented in this report summarize the status of economic activity for population aged 15 years and above, who are economically active (employed or unemployed/seeking work) and economically inactive individuals, which are those who were neither employed nor looking for jobs.

The labour force presented in this report is drawn from two (2) target populations, one covering individuals aged 15 years and above and the other for individuals aged 18 years and above. Analysis and commentary focuses on the target population of 15 years and above.


The headline indicators include total labour force, employed and unemployed, Unemployment rates, employment by occupation and industry.

2.1 Population Aged 15 Years and Above

Figure 1.1 presents information on the target population, aged 15 years and above, which was estimated at 1,637,822. The Labour Force (economically active population), which participated actively in the economy, was estimated at 969,734 (59.2.0 percent) of the target population, of which 717,418 (74.0 percent) was employed, and 252,316 (26.0 percent) was unemployed. Compared with the fourth quarter of 2020, the labour force indicates a decrease of 0.3 percent, from 972,606 in Q4 2020 to 969,734 in Q4 2021.

The population outside labour force or economically inactive population aged 15 years and above stood at 668,088. These include homemakers, students, elderlies & the sick, and others. Homemakers accounted for the highest percentage (35.6 percent) of population outside labour force with 238,019 persons, followed by students at 29.4 percent, with 196,174 persons. See **Table LFO1** in **Appendix 3**.







2.2 Labour Force (Economically Active Population) by Sex

The total labour force aged 15 years and above was estimated at 969,734 persons, comprising of 468,334 (48.3 percent) males, and 501,400 (51.7 percent females) as presented in Figure 1.2 below. Out of a total of 252,316 job seekers, 55.4 percent (139,753) were females, compared with 44.6 percent (112,563) males.

2.3 Population Aged 18 years and Over

Figure 1.3 above shows the population aged 18 years and above. The total number of persons aged 18 years and above was estimated at 1,504,263, of which 965,680 were the labour force and 538,583 were outside the labour force. The Labour Force or economically active consisted of 716,510 employed and 249,171 unemployed persons.

2.4 Employment to Population Ratio (EPR)

The Employment to Population Ratio (EPR) reflects the extent to which a country's population is growing compared with the creation of employment, that is, EPR is an indicator showing the ability of the economy to provide employment to its growing population. A decline in EPR may be considered an indication of the economic slowdown.

A high EPR value means that a large proportion of a country's population is employed, while a low value means that a large share of the population is not involved directly in market-related production activities, either because they are unemployed or (more likely) out of the labour force altogether.




Figure 1.4: Employment To Population Ratio, QMTS Q4 2021

The results showed that in the fourth quarter of 2021 (October to December) the overall Employment to Population Ratio was estimated at 43.8 percent, (1.5 percentage points less than the estimate recorded for the fourth quarter of 2020, see Table 1.0), with males and females recording 47.8 and 40.5 percent respectively. Between quarter four 2020 and quarter 4 2021, the EPR decreased by 1.5 percentage points, from 45.4 percent estimated for quarter four 2020, to 43.8 estimated for quarter four 2021, (Table 1.1). The ratio for males was higher than that of their female counterparts for all the age groups except for age group 55-59. See figure 1.4 below.

2.5 Labour Force Participation Rates (LFPR)

The total labour force participation rate by age group between males and females is shown in Figure 1. 5. The LFPR reflects the extent to which a country's working age group is economically active. The labour force participation rate is the proportion of a country's working-age population that engages actively in the labour market, either by working or looking for work; it provides an indication of the size of the supply of labour available to engage in the production of goods and services, relative to the population of working age group.

The total LFPR was estimated at 59.2 percent, with males recording 62.9 percent compared to 56.1 percent recorded for females. For both males and females, the participation rate in economic activity was higher for age groups between 25-29 and 50-54 years. The highest rate was recorded for age group 40-44 at 84.0 percent, followed by the age groups 35-39 and 30-34 with 81.1 and 79.0 percent respectively. From the age group 55-59, the rate declined gradually until it reached 5.2 percent for age group 75 and above.

The total LFPR went down by 0.8 percentage point, from 60.0 percent estimated in quarter four 2020 to 59.2 percent in guarter four of 2021, see **Table 1.2a**.




Figure 1.5: Labour Force Participation Rates, QMTS Q4 2021

2.6 Total Employed Population

2.6.1 Employed Population Characteristics (Population 15 years and above)

Employed persons refer to all persons who reported to have done some work (even if it was at least for an hour) in the specified reference period for pay or profit gain. Employed comprise of those in Paid employment or Self-employment. Paid employment includes those who did some work for wages or salary earnings (in cash or in kind payment) and those who were temporarily away for specific reasons but would definitely return to their paid jobs. Self-employment refers to those who work in their own businesses/ enterprises.

2.6.2 Total employed population





Figure 1.6: Total Employed persons by Sex - QMTS Q4, 2021

The QMTS quarter (Q4) 2021 recorded a total of 717,418 employed persons of which 49.6 percent (355,771 persons) were males and 50.4 percent were females (36,1647persons) during the three months of the survey, being October to December 2021 (Quarter 4 2021). See figure 1.6 and Table 1.3a

Figure 1.7 below shows the overall employment of different quarters for different years. There were some minor differences in the overall employment figures. The results for Q4 2019 and Q1 2020 showed an increase in total employment from 742,378 in Q4 2019 to 751,798 in Q1 2020, an increase of 9,420 persons over a period of three months. In addition comparisons by sex showed that for both Q1 & Q4 2020 employed males were more than females while for Q 2019 & Q4 2021 females outstood males.





2.6.3 Total Employed by District

The currently employed persons by district is displayed in Tables 1.3a & 1.3b. From Table 1.3a, Gaborone had the highest number of employed persons followed by Kweneng East and South East districts respectively. Gaborone accounted for 16.1 percent of the total employed, with Kweneng East recording 14.2 percent, followed by South East with 8.1 percent, of the overall employment. Kweneng East recorded a decreased in employment from 16.6 percent in Q4 2020 to 14.2 percent in Q4 2021, whereas Gaborone recorded an increase in total employed persons from 14.5 percent in Q4 2020 to 16.1 percent in Q4 2021.



2.6.4 Employed by age group

Presentation of the currently employed persons by age group is shown in Tables 1.4a, 1.4b, 1.4c, Figure 1.8 below & 1.9 below, Table 1.4a being employed for age 15 years and above whereas Table11.4b is for those aged 18 years and above and Table 1.4c is for the quarterly figures from Q3 2019 to Q4 2021. Persons in the age group 35 - 39 constituted the highest proportion of total employment with 17.3 percent, followed by those aged 30 - 34 with 15.4 percent. Age groups 25 - 29 and 40 - 44 were third and the fourth largest at 15.2 percent and 14.6 percent, respectively.





Furthermore employment by sex and age group showed that in the indicated highest top three groups, males were in the majority in the age group 30 - 34 whereas females were in the majority in the remaining two age groups (35 - 39 & 25 - 29). See table 1.4a



Total employment for age group 35 – 39 increased from 16.9 percent in Q4 2020 to 17.3 percent in Q4 2021, while the age groups 30 – 34 and 25 – 29 recorded a decline in employment. 2.6.5 Employed by Occupation

Occupation is described as the specific set of tasks and duties which are carried out or assigned to an individual to perform. It provides information on the distribution of employment across different occupational categories. Additionally the information is important in identifying the changes in skill levels in the labour force of a country, as well its economic stage and resultant employment opportunities.




Figure 1.10: Currently Employed by Occupation & Sex QMTS Q4, 2021

Figure 1.10 and Table 1.5a and Table 1.5b below present employment by occupational categories. Results showed that the majority of employees were in the elementary and service/sales occupational categories. This was the case in the previous quarters. Elementary and service/sales workers occupations usually include among others jobs like cleaners, laborers', domestic workers, shop sales assistants, cashiers, stall and market sales persons, security guards etc. They usually do not require high levels of skills associated with higher levels of education and/or training education. They are mostly simple and routine tasks that can be performed using hand held tools.

Out of a total of 717,418 employed persons, 26.6 percent (190,693 persons) reported being elementary occupations followed by those in Service/sales workers category with 171,289 persons (23.9 percent). Craft and Related Trades Workers constituted 11.5 percent of the total employed.

Comparisons of occupational categories by sex showed that in most occupations females recorded the highest proportions as compared to males, except in occupations such as Skilled Agricultural, Forestry & Fishery Workers, Craft & Related Trades Workers and Plant & Machine operator's occupations which are usually dominated by males. For plant & machine operators males recorded 86.2 percent, compared to only 13.8 percent for females, whereas in clerical support occupations, females recorded the highest proportion of 70.8 percent, than their male counterparts of 29.2 percent. See table 1.5a below.

From table 1.5b it is observed that both elementary and service/sales workers recoded a decline in employment in this quarter compared with Q4 of 2020. Elementary occupations dropped from 27.2 percent in Q4 2020 to 26.6 percent in Q4 2021 while service/sales workers also declined from 24.1 percent in Q4 2020 to 23.9 percent in Q4 2021. On the other side Craft & related trades workers had an increase in employment (from 10.9 percent in Q4 2020 to 11.5 percent in Q4 2021.

2.6.6 Employed by Sector/ Employer category

Sector /employer category refers to whom the person/ individual works for, for example central government, private sector, parastatals etc.

Employment by sector/ employer category is presented in **Tables 1.6a**, **1.6b** and **Figure 1.11**. The results showed that the Private sector remains the leading employer constituting 34.7 percent of overall employment. This is an increase in employment from 34.2 percent which was reported in Q4 of 2020. The Central government was the second largest employer with 18.2 percent followed by Self-employment in own non-agriculture business which declined from 17.2 percent in Q4 2020 to 16.3 percent in this quarter.

Employment for those who are in piece jobs declined from 7.7 percent in Q4 2020 to 6.4 percent in Q4 2021.

Figure 1.11: Currently Employed by Sector/Employer category QMTS Q4, 2021






Figure 1.12: Currently Employed by Industry, Q4 2020 & 2021

Urban areas employment declined from 46.7 percent in Q4 2020 to 45.6 percent in Q4 2021, Rural Areas from 28.2 percent to 27.7 percent. Employment for Cities & Towns increased from 25.1 percent in Q4 2020 to 26.7 percent in Q4 2021.





Figure 1.13 presents employment data by strata and sex for Q4 2020 & Q4 2021. For the last quarter of 2021, employment for females in Urban Areas was slightly higher than for males (46.8 percent and 44.3 percent respectively). In Rural Areas males' employment was constant at 28.0 percent in both quarters, while employment for females declined from 28.5 percent in Q4 2020 to 27.5 percent in Q4 2021.

2.6.9 Employed by Marital Status

This section presents the employed population by their marital status.

Figure 1.14 shows that the majority of employed persons were those who were in the never married category at 41.3 percent, followed by those in the living together category with 34.0 percent, and the married with 21.5 percent. Divorced and separated were the least with 1.1 and 0.1 percent's respectively.

Within the married and the living together categories, employed males were higher than females, whereas for the other remaining categories females' employment was higher than that of males. In never married category, 52.2 percent were females while 47.8 percent were males.





2.6.10 Employed by Education

Education and training play an important I role in the labour force. It empowers individuals with certain skills and knowledge required to participate meaningfully in the labour market. As the economy grows and diversify, the labour force should also evolve to meet the requirements of the demand side of the labour market.

Tables 1.10a, **1.10b** and **figure 1.15** provide information on education levels of the employed population. Persons with Secondary education constituted the largest share of the employed persons, accounting for 46.7 percent, followed by those with university education with 18.2 percent while those with primary education were third with 11.0 percent.



Furthermore, comparisons of employed population by educational level for Q 2020 & 2021 showed that persons who had general education constituted the highest proportion in overall employment. This group reported to having no training. This could explain, to some extent the high numbers of employment in Elementary occupations. **See figure 1.15 below and tables M4 & M6 in the appendix tables.**

3.0 FORMAL SECTOR EMPLOYMENT, FORMAL EMPLOYMENT AND AVERAGE EARNINGS, QMTS Q4 2021

3.1 Formal Sector Employment

This section presents information on Formal Sector Employment from the 2021 quarter four QMTS. The module was administered to individuals aged 15 years and above.

Formal sector employment refers to work in an establishment that is registered as a company, keeps a set of formal accounts and has employed five or more employees. In general Formal Sector Employment comprise of people who are working in the companies which fall under the following categories:

1. Companies which are formally registered with;

- Tax Authorities
- Department of Trade and Industry
- Professional Institutions

2. The threshold for Formal Sector Employment Surveys in terms of employment in Botswana include companies employing five (5) employees and above.

3. The Companies or Businesses must have an office or a permanent structure of location and they are not supposed to be operating in Households.

Total formal sector employment was recorded at 494,457, of which 232,394 were males (47.0 percent) and 262,063 (53.0 percent) were females (Table 1.11a). Comparison of the 2021 fourth quarter of QMTS Formal Sector Employment with the fourth quarter of 2020 showed that there had been an increase in formal sector employment. The employment increased from 477,915 persons to 494, 457 persons. This is an increase of 3.5 percent (16,741 persons). Comparing Q4 2019 with Q4 2021, the formal sector employment showed an increase, of 1.8 percent, from 485,524 in 2019 to 494,457 in 2021. See Table 1.11c.

3.1.1 Formal Sector Employment by Industry, Citizenship and Sex

Table 1.11a and **Table 1.11b** present formal sector employment by citizenship. The tables show that out of the 494,457 in the Formal Sector Employment, 16, 740 were non-citizens, (3.4 percent), while 477,717 were citizens, (96.6 percent). At the industry level, Wholesale, Retail & Repair of Motor Vehicles had more non-citizens employees, recording 22.8 percent (3,819 persons), followed by Education and Manufacturing with 16.5 (2,762 persons) and 13.4 percent (2,239 persons), respectively.

Formal Sector Employment by Industry showed that Public Administration had the largest proportion of employment at 22.9 percent (113,196 persons), followed by Education with 15.1 percent (74,463 persons) and Wholesale, Retail & Repair of Motor Vehicles at 13.8 percent (68,386 persons) of total employment. At the industry level, Education had employed more females, accounting for 73.8 percent of employees working in the industry, followed by Other Service Activities with 71.8 percent. Real Estate Activities and Construction Activities were the two industries which had employed the lowest proportion of females, recording 13.4 percent and 15.6 percent respectively. See Table FSE 3 from Appendix 3.

3.1.2 Formal Sector Employment by Age Group and Sex




Figure 1.16 : Formal Sector Employment by Age Group and Sex, Q4 2021

Figure 1.16 shows that persons employed in the Formal Sector are largely concentrated in the ages 25 to 44 years, with age group 35-39 recording the highest employment with 17.3 percent (85,709 persons). The 25-29 and 30 – 34 years age groups followed with 15.3 percent each (75,881 and (75,465 persons). Age group 40-44 recorded 14.9 (73,563 persons) percent. The figure shows that from age group 35-39 to 65-69, the female formal sector employment was above male employment. See **Table FSE 2 from Appendix 3**.

3.1.3 Formal Sector Employment by District and Sex

Table 1.12a and Table 1.12b show that Gaborone recorded the highest number of people working in the Formal Sector, recording 19.0 percent, followed by Kweneng East with 14.6 percent and South East with 8.0 percent. Out of the seven cities/towns, males were in the majority except in Selibe Phikwe, Lobatse and Jwaneng, which recorded 64.9, 52.5 and 51.2 percent of females in Formal Sector Employment respectively. Formal sector employment for females was higher than that of males in all the districts except Kgalagadi South, Kgatleng, Kweneng East and Central Boteti District. Overall females employment in the formal sector were in the majority, constituting 53.0 percent as compared to the 47.0 percent for males.

3.1.4 Formal Sector Employment by Education Level

The majority of people, 42.6 percent, employed in Formal Sector Employment had secondary school education as their highest educational attainment. These were followed by those with University and College education with 24.2 and 9.5 percent respectively. A small percentage (0.4 percent and 0.7 percent) of people in Formal Sector Employment had non-formal education and apprenticeship. See Table 1.13a and Table 1.13b.



3.1.5 Formal Sector Employment by Occupation

Figure 1.17, Tables FSE1a and FSE1b in Appendix 3 show formal sector employment by occupations. The largest proportion was found in the Service/Sales Workers with 127,849 persons (25.9 percent), followed by the Elementary occupations with 109,872 persons (22.2 percent) and Technicians at 65,362 persons (13.2 percent).





3.1.6 Average monthly cash earnings from Formal Sector Employment by occupation for Wage Earners

Table 1.14 shows monthly average cash earning by occupation for wage earners. The average earnings for Managers were the highest at P16,696, followed by Professionals at P15,802, and Technicians & Associate Professionals with P12,320. Elementary occupations average earnings were lowest at P1,384.

3.1.7 Average monthly cash earnings from Formal Sector Employment by Industry for Wage Earners

Table 1.15 presents the estimated average cash earning for formal sector employment wage earners by industry and citizenship (both Citizens and Non – citizens). Average earnings was estimated at P6,219 for citizens, and P9,275 for non-citizen. The average earnings for all employees (Citizen and Non-Citizens) was P6,299. The table shows that in almost all the industries, average cash earnings 'for males were higher than those of females, except in few industries like Mining & Quarrying, Electricity, Gas, & Air Supply, Water Supply & Waste Management, Transport & Storage and Information and Communication.

Overall, male employees' average monthly cash earnings were estimated at P6,963 compared to P5,734 for their female counterparts in the formal sector.

The average monthly cash earnings for all employees (citizens and non-citizens) was estimated at P6,299 in the fourth quarter 2021, compared to P6,014 in the fourth quarter of 2020, an increase of 4.7

3.2 FORMAL EMPLOYMENT, QMTS Q4 2020

This section presents information on Formal Employment from the fourth quarter of 2021 (October to December). The module was administered to individuals aged 15 years and above.

Formal employment or jobs refers to work in which an establishment engages an employee under a working agreement that includes, salary or wages, health benefits, defined work hours and workdays. In general Formal Employment or Jobs include employment which is liable for taxation, pension or gratuity, paid leave, maternity leave, allowances and medical services, among others. Employees under formal employment are supposed to be protected under various schemes like the minimum wages act, factories act, among others. Workers are supposed to work a fixed number of hours, if they work more hours they are supposed to be paid overtime or given off days.

Total formal employment was recorded at 394,446 of which 196,581 were males (49.8 percent) and 197,865 (50.2 percent) were females (see Table 1.16a).

3.2.1 Formal Employment by Industry, Citizenship and Sex

Table 1.16a and **Table 1.16b** present formal employment by citizenship. The tables show that out of the 394,446 persons in formal employment, 17,159 were non-citizens, (4.4 percent), while 377,287 were citizens, (95.6 percent). At the industry level, Agriculture Activities had most non-citizens employees, recorded 25.0 percent (4,295 persons), followed by Education at 12.4 percent (2,134 persons), and Wholesale, Retail & Repair of Motor Vehicles with 10.8 percent (1,848 persons).

3.2.2 Formal employment by Age Group and Sex




Figure 1.18: Formal Employment by Age Group and Sex - Q4 2021

Figure 1.18 shows that formal employment was concentrated in the age group 35-39 years, with 18.7 percent (73,743 persons). The 30-34 and 40-45 years age groups followed with 16.0 percent each, (63,118 and 62,964 persons). Age groups 25-29 and 45-49 recorded 14.0 (55,877 persons) and 11.9 (46,789 persons) percent respectively.

3.2.3 Formal Employment by District and Sex

Table 1.18 shows that Gaborone had the highest number of Formal Employment, recording 20.3 percent, followed by Kweneng East with 16.0 percent and South East at 10.3 percent. In cities/towns, males were the majority in formal employment, except for Selibe Phikwe and Jwaneng, which recorded 65.1 percent and 50.5 percent of females in Formal Employment. There were more males in formal employment compared to females in most of the districts.. Overall, females constituted 50.2 percent of formal employment.

3.2.4 Formal Employment by Education Level

The highest percentage (41.8 percent) of people in Formal Employment had secondary school education as their highest level of attainment followed by those with University education with 25.8 percent. A small percentage (0.1 and 0.8 percent) of people in Formal Employment had non-formal education and apprenticeship respectively. See Table 1.19a and 1.19b

3.2.5 Formal Employment by Occupation




Figure 1.19: Formal Employment by Occupation and Sex

Figure 1.19 and Tables 1.20 show formal employment by occupations. The largest proportion of formal employees were found in the Service/Sales Workers occupations with 112,005 persons (28.4 percent), followed by the Elementary occupations with 62,042 persons (15.7 percent) and Technicians at 61,933 persons (15.7 percent).

3.2.6 Formal Employment by Industry

Table 1.21 presents Formal Employment by Industry. Overall, Wholesale, Retail & Sale of Motor Vehicles had the largest portion of employment at 15.5 (61,307 persons), followed by Public Administration and Education, with 15.4 percent each, (60,773 and 60,561 persons) and Administrative & Support Service at 10.9 percent (43,061 persons) of total formal employment.

Within industries, Households as Employers employed more females, accounting for 93.6 percent of employees working in the industry, followed by Finance & Insurance Activities with 75.2 percent. Mining & Quarrying and Information & Communication were the two industries which had employed the lowest proportion of females, recording 22.9 percent and 24.3 percent of female employees respectively.

3.2.7 Monthly cash earnings from Formal Employment by Industry

Table 1.22 presents estimated average monthly cash earning for formal employees by industry and citizenship (both Citizens and Non – citizens). The average monthly cash earnings were at P7,238 for citizens, P7,057 for non-citizens, and P7,230 for all employees (citizens and non-citizens) Average monthly cash earnings for males and females in formal employment were estimated at P7,429 and P7,032,

Table 1.23 shows the numbers of employees in formal employment grouped by average monthly cash earnings ranges.. The table shows that 30.1 percent of persons in formal employment earned P2,001 – P4,000, followed by 24.2 and 23.3 percent who were earning in the ranges of P10,001 – P30,000 and P2,001 – P4, 000, respectively.

3.2.8 Monthly cash earnings from Formal Employment by occupation

Table 1.24 shows monthly average cash earnings by occupation. The average earnings for Managers were the highest recording an estimated average of P17,590, followed by Professionals and Technicians & associate professionals at P15,951 and P12,400, respectively. Elementary occupations average earnings were the lowest at P2,051.

Tables 1.25 and **1.26** show occupation by the range of monthly earnings for formal employees. The tables show that most of the employees in formal employment (66.5 percent) who were earning P501 – P1,000, were working as Service/Sales Workers. For the group of employees who were earning between P10,001 and P30,000, 38.6 percent of them were technicians, followed by professionals at 30.8 percent.

3.3 Average Earnings in Pula




Figure 1.20: Average Earnings (pulas) by Citizenship and Sex- QMTS Q4_2021

Figure 1.20 below shows overall average cash earnings (in pula) for both Citizen and Non – citizen wage earners for Quarter four 2021. The total average earnings were estimated at P5, 320. This is a 6.4 percent increase as compared to the P4, 997 (pula) that were estimated for Quarter four 2020. Average earnings for citizens was estimated at P5, 426. Non-citizen average earnings was P3, 846. Males average earnings (5, 587 pula) were higher than that of their female counterparts which were estimated at 5,062 pula. For non-citizens, females average earnings (5, 127 pula) were higher than males average earnings (3,244 pula).

Comparison of average earnings for Q4-2019, Q4-2020 and Q4-2021 indicates that average earning at the end of each of the three years of the survey were relatively stable. In Q4-2019, the earnings were 4,989. The earnings went down to 4,977 in Q4-2020 and increased to 5,320 in Q4-2021. There was an increase of 6.6 percent in average earning from the first quarter of the survey (Q4-2019) to the last quarter (Q4-2021). **(Table AE 1a)**





Figure 1.21: Average Earnings (pula) by Occupation, Citizenship and Sex- QMTS Q4_2021

Average earnings at occupation level for both citizens and Non- citizens is shown in **Figure 1.21** below. The highest Average Earnings (pula) was recorded by Other Specialised Professional Services Personnel with 22, 192 pula. This category comprises citizen wage earners only. Managers, Professionals and Technicians & Associate Professionals recorded total average earnings of 16,567, 15, 587 and 12,071 pula respectively. All occupation categories recorded higher total average earnings for males except for Managers and Clerical Support Services. For non- citizens, female Managers recorded the highest average earnings of 30, 039 pula.

Figure 1.22 below depicts average earnings by occupation categories between Q2 2021 and Q4 2020. All occupation categories recorded an increase in average earnings, except for Managers, Professionals and Plant & Machine Operators. Average earnings for Skilled Agric. workers increased from 400 pula in quarter four 2020 to 2,938 in quarter four 2021.





4.0 UNEMPLOYED AND UNDER EMPLOYED POPULATION

4.1.1 Currently Unemployed

Currently Unemployed persons refer to persons who did not do some work in the reference period (past 7 days) for payment (either in cash or in kind), profit or family gain. These people should have been actively seeking work in the past thirty days and were available to start work. The currently unemployed excludes individuals who were temporarily absent from work, s and were definitely going to return to work

Discouraged job seekers or relaxed job seekers are persons outside the labour force who wanted employment and were currently available but did not seek employment during the reference. The discouraged job seekers are a subset of the potential labour force, or more particularly, a subset of the "available potential jobseekers." In the reference period. The discouraged job seekers are those who indicate that they wanted to be employed and were available for employment, but were not actively seeking employment for labour market related reasons as opposed to personal, family or other non-labour related reasons.

Comparison of the estimated total number of unemployed persons for quarters four of 2019, 2020 and 2021 shows an annual increase. In guarter four of 2019, the unemployed persons were estimated at 211, 473, increasing to 238, 731 in quarter four of 2020. The 2021 fourth quarter estimate was 252, 316, an increase of 5.7 percent on quarter four of 2020. (Table 2.1 a)

The total number of discouraged job seekers for Quarter four 2021 was estimated at 76,984. This shows an annual decline of 5.2 percent (4,024), compared to the 81,008 that was estimated for guarter four of 2020.i.

The extended unemployment - sums the number of actively seeking work with those who discouraged jobseekers in the reference period. The extended unemployed persons were estimated at 329,301 in guarter four of 2021. Of these, 76.6 percent were actively seeking work and 23.4 percent were discouraged job seekers. (Table 2.1b)

Overall unemployment rate for quarter four 2021 was estimated at 26.0 percent, This is an increase of 1.5 percentage points compared to the 24.5 percent unemployment rate estimated for the fourth quarter of 2020.. This estimate the percentage of labour force which was **actively seeking work** during the reference period. Female unemployment rate was estimated at 27.9 percent, compared with 24.0 percent for males.

Unemployment rate has been increasing from year to year. In quarter four 2019, the rate was recorded at 22.2 percent. The following year (quarter four of 2020), 24.5 percent was recorded. In quarter four 2021, the rate continued to go up, reaching 26.0 percent. The annual change between quarter four of 2019 and quarter four 2020 showed an increase by 2.3 percentage points in the overall unemployment rate. Between quarter four 2021, an annual increase of 1.5 percentage points was recorded. (Table 2.1 c)

Quarter four 2021 estimate for the extended unemployment rate was 31.1 percent as compared to 30.3 percent recorded in quarter four of 2020.




Figure 2.1: Unemployment Rate by Age Group, QMTS Q4_ 2021 & Q4_ 2020

Unemployment rate (actively seeking) for quarter four 2021 and quarter four 2020 by age group is displayed in **Figure 2.1** below. Age groups 15-17 to 20-29 recorded unemployment rates above overall unemployment of 26.0 percent. Age group 15-17 recorded the highest unemployment rate of 77.6 percent, followed by the 18-19 age group with 55.5 percent. Age groups 20-24 and 25-29 recorded 45.1 and 30.0 percent respectively. This shows unemployment rate decreasing with age, that is, it is highest for younger age groups. The same scenario was observed in the previous quarter (quarter 4 2020).

Overall unemployment rate for persons aged 18 years and above, (actively seeking work) was estimated at 25.8 percent. This is a 0.2 percentage point difference when compared to the 26.0 percent rate recorded for ages 15 years and above. The estimated unemployment rate for females for the labour force aged 18 years and above was 27.8 percent compared to 23.8 percent for males. See **Table 2.1d**

Unemployment rate for labour force aged15 years and above at stratum level showed Urban Areas recording the highest rate of 29.1 percent. Rural Areas and Cities & Towns recorded 28.0 and 17.6 percent respectively. Unemployment rate for females was higher than that of males in all strata. The highest rate for females was recorded in urban villages at 30.3 percent, with the highest for males also in the urban Villages stratum at 27.8 percent.

4.1.2 Currently unemployed by duration looking for Work

Table 2.3 presents unemployed population (actively seeking work), by duration looking for work or attempting to start a business. The results showed that, 41.8 percent (105,474 persons) reported that they have been seeking work for two years and more. These were followed by persons who reported to have been looking for work for one to two years at 22.3 percent (56,289), whilst those who reported that they spent six month to twelve months stood at 13.4 percent (33,890).

Amongst persons who spent two (2) years or more looking for work, the majority were in Urban villages with a record of 58,956 (55.9 percent). Rural areas followed with 29,903 (28.4 percent) and Cities and Towns recorded 16,614 (15.8 percent).

4.1.3 Currently Unemployed Population by Education Level




Figure 2.2: Unemployment by Education Level (%) QMTS Q4_2021

Analysis of the unemployed persons by level of education showed that Secondary education holders were in the majority, constituting 65.1 percent of the unemployed, followed by Primary school holders and University graduates at 11.5 and 8.6 percent respectively. Amongst the unemployed Secondary education holders, 43.7 percent (71,737) were males whilst 56.3 percent were females (92,460). See **figure 2.2** below.

4.2 UNDER-EMPLOYMENT

Under-employment covers all persons who worked for less than 35 hours, and also reported that they were available to work more hours. Time-related underemployment, is when the working time of persons in employment is insufficient in relation to alternative employment situations in which persons are willing and available to engage.

The time-related underemployment rate is a measure of labour underutilization that provides information regarding the share of employed persons who are willing and available to increase their working time and worked fewer hours than a specified time threshold during the reference period, which is 35 hours.

Time related under employment is one of the aspects of labour underutilization, which others are unemployment rate and the potential labour force. It signals inadequate employment and complements other indicators of labour slack.

In general persons in time-related underemployment are all persons in employment who, during a short, specified period,

- Wanted to work additional hours,
- Whose working time in all jobs were less than a specified hours threshold,
- Who was available to work additional hours if given an opportunity to do more work.

4.2.1 Currently Under-Employed

The number of persons who reported that they were currently under-employed stood at 46,988, representing 6.5 percent of the total currently employed population (717,418). Of the 46,988 persons currently under employed, 38,377 were females (81.7 percent) and 8,611 males (18.3 percent).

4.2.2 Currently Under-Employed by Industry

Table 3.1 below shows under employed people by Industry and Sex. The table shows that 69.3 percent of the under employed were working in public administration, followed by those who were working in Education and Human Health & Social Work Activities with 18.8 percent and 2.9 percent respectively.

4.2.3 Currently Under-Employed by Strata

Table UNDE 5a and **UNDE 5b** from Appendix 3 show Under-employment by strata. Under-employment was more prevalent in rural areas and urban villages (60.0 and 32.1 percent respectively) compared to Cities/towns at 7.9 percent. The tables also show that under employment was mostly among people working in Ipelegeng projects which falls under Local Government, recording 73.4 percent followed by Central Government with 15.6 percent.

4.2.4 Currently Under-Employed by Hours Worked

Under-employed by hours worked indicated that the majority (95.8 percent) of the under-employed worked between 15 and 34 hours per week. Persons who worked between 1 and 9 hours accounted for only 2.0 percent of the total. See **Table 3.2**.

4.2.5 Currently Under-Employed by Education Level

Table 3.3 below shows that Under-employment was more prevalent amongst persons who completed secondary and primary school with 29,311 (62.4 percent) and 9,889 persons (21.0 percent) respectively. The least affected group was those who have brigade education with 1,038 persons (2.2 percent).

5.0 DISABILITY IN LABOUR FORCE

Literature from the past has shown that people living with disabilities were frequently denied or had limited opportunities to work. They were faced with barriers to equal job opportunities as compared to those without disabilities. Majority of employers are still hesitant to employ people with disabilities because they believe they may bring problems in the workplace. Only a few employers are willing to hire workers with disabilities. This as a result makes people living with disability to be affected by high unemployment and insufficient social protection which then further increases their risk of poverty. The International Labour Organisation (ILO) is advocating for the inclusion of people with disability in the world of work and Botswana as a country too is advocating for their inclusion in the work places.

For the QMTS, Washington Group Short Set of Questions on Disability was used. These questions ask about difficulties an individual may have when doing certain activities because of a health problem. From this set of questions, two options being, "Yes a lot of difficulty" and "cannot do it at all" were used to select people with disability.

5.1 Labour Force with Disability

Table 4.0 below shows the estimates of total labour force for people living with disability. The total labour force for people with disability was estimated at 11,553 persons, an increase of 2,904 persons over a period of twelve months (from 8,649 persons recorded in Q4 2020). From this total, 4,313 persons were males while 7,240 were females. In addition 2,195 persons were unemployed whereas 9,358 persons were employed. Furthermore the data showed the majority of labour force with disability were in Urban Villages(6,185), 3,708 were in rural areas and 1,661 in Cities & Towns.

5.2 Currently Employed Persons with Disability

In this quarter, from a total estimate of 717,418 employed persons about 1.3 percent (9,358 persons) reported to be people living with disability. This is an increase by 3,361 persons from the last quarter of 2020 (from 5,997 persons in Q4 2020) to 9,358 persons in Q4 2021.







Table 4.1 below presents an estimates of employed persons with disability disaggregated by strata and sex. Comparison of the last quarters of 2020 & 2021, showed that for Q4 2021, urban areas had majority of employed persons with disability followed by rural areas and lastly Cities and Towns with 56.1 percent, 31.2 percent and 12.7 percent respectively. Whereas for Q4 2020, rural areas recorded the highest percentage at 44.0 percent, followed by Cities & Towns with 36.6 percent and Urban Villages at 19.5 percent.

Presentation of employment for people with disability is shown in *figure 4.2 below and table DA5 in the appendix*. Unlike for the total employment for all (15 years and above) where elementary occupations constituted the largest share, for employed persons with disability, service/sales workers occupational category was the highest with 32.9 percent followed by elementary occupations with 21.3 percent.

5.3 Unemployment of persons with Disability

Q4 2021 recorded a total of 2,195 persons as the number of unemployed persons with disability. This is a decrease from 2,652 persons which was recorded in Q4 2020. Unemployment rate for persons with disability was estimated at 19.0 percent. Male's unemployment rate stood at 19.0 percent compared to 24.5 percent for females. See table DA1 & DA3 in the appendix.




Figure 4.3: Total Unemployed persons with disability by Strata & Sex, Q4 2021

Figure 4.3 below shows that 933 persons reported to be in urban areas followed by rural areas with 787 persons and then Cities and towns with 475 persons.

Unemployed population with disability by age group is presented in **Table 4.2 below**. The results show that there were 1.055 males and 1,145 females. Age groups 30 -34 years & 50 -54 years were the highest with each constituting 422 persons (19.2 percent each), followed by 40 –44 years and 20 –24 years with 17.5 percent (384 persons) and 17.3 percent (379 persons) each respectively.

6.0 YOUTH (15 – 35 years) LABOUR FORCE

Youth population (15-35 years) for Quarter four 2021 was estimated at 861,672 persons. This is a decrease of 1.2 percent (10,127), compared to the fourth quarter of 2020 results, which estimated the total youth population at 861,672 persons. Male youth population recorded 48.2 percent (410,258) while females recorded 51.8 percent (441,287) of the total youth population. (Table YE1 Appendix 3)

6.1 Youth Labour Force

Youth Labour Force was estimated at 486,706 persons. The Employed were estimated at 319,489 (65.6 percent) of the total youth labour force, while 167,216 (34.4 percent) were the unemployed. Analysis by education level shows that most of the youth labour force had completed Secondary education (63.8 percent). These were followed by the youth who completed University and Education College with 14.6 and 6.3 percent respectively.

6.2 Employed youth




Figure 5.1: Employed Youth by Age Group (%), QMTS Q4_2021

Out of the 319,489 employed youth, 53.0 percent (169,472) were males while 47.0 percent (150,017) were females. Age groups 30–34, 25–29 and 20-24 contributed the largest share to the youth employed population with 34.7, 34.2 and 20.3 percent respectively. See **Figure 5.1 and Table YE2 Appendix 3**.

The results indicate that most of the employed youth were in Urban Villages with a total of 148,296 persons. This accounts for 46.4 percent of the total employed youth population. Rural Areas recorded 87,380 (27.3 percent) while Cities and Towns recorded the lowest number of the employed youth population with 83,814 (26.2 percent).

Table YE7 – Appendix 3 shows employed youth population by occupation. The majority of the employed youth was in Service & Sales with a record of 30.6 percent. These were followed by youth employed in Elementary Occupations with 29.1 percent. Youth in category of Other specialized professionals recorded the lowest proportion of the employed youth with 0.1 percent.

6.3 Youth Unemployment rate


Youth unemployment rate for quarter four 2021 was estimated at 34.4 percent. Females recorded unemployment rate of 38.1 percent compared to 30.6 percent recorded by their male counterparts.

Unemployment rate by age group shows that the rate was highly concentrated in age group 15-17 with a record of 77.6 percent. Age group 18-19 recorded 55.5 percent, followed by Age group 20-24 with 45.1 percent. **(Table YE2 Appendix 3)**

6.3.1 Total Unemployed Youth by Education

Secondary school holders were the most affected by unemployment, recording 73.5 percent of the total unemployed youth, followed by Primary school levers with 5.7 percent. Education College and Technical/ Vocational holders recorded 3.9 and 3.7 percent respectively. Unemployed Secondary school holders comprised 44.8 percent males and 55.2 percent females.

6.3.2 Unemployed Youth by Strata





Figure 5.3: Unemployed Youth by Rgion (%), QMTS Q4_2021

Figure 5.3 below shows that majority of the unemployed youth population were recorded in Urban villages with 53.8 percent, followed by unemployed youth in Rural Areas and Cities & Towns with 29.1 and 17.1 percent respectively.

Analysis by marital status of the Unemployed youth indicates that persons who never married accounted for 71.4 percent, followed by the Living together with 25.8 percent. The Married constituted 2.6 percent of the total unemployed youth. No unemployed youth reported the Separated status.





6.4 YOUTH NOT IN EDUCATION, NOT IN EMPLOYMENT OR TRAINING (NEET)

The share of youth not in education, employment or training (also known as "the NEET rate") provides a measure of youth who are outside the educational system, not in training and not in employment, and thus serves as a broader measure of potential youth labour market entrants. It shows the number of young person's not in education, employment or training as a percentage of the total youth population.

The total number of youth not in education, employment or training from the quarter four of 2021 results was estimated at 322,849 persons. Of these, 41.6 percent (139,853) were male and 58.4 percent (196069) were females. The total number shows an increase of 13,074 persons (4.0 percent) from the 322,849 that was recorded in quarter four 2020 of the survey. **See Table YE8 Appendix 3**.

The overall NEET rate as shown in **Table 5.1 below**, was estimated at 39.4 percent as compared to 39.0 percent that was estimated for quarter four of 2020. Male NEET rate was 34.1 percent whilst females recorded 44.4 percent. Age group 20-24 recorded the highest NEET rate (51.2 percent), followed by the 18-19 and 25-29 years age groups with 45.8 and 42.2 percent respectively.

7.0 POPULATION OUTSIDE THE LABOUR FORCE (POLF)

A person is outside the labour force, according to the International Labour Organization definition, if he or she is not part of the labour force, meaning he or she is neither employed nor unemployed/actively seeking work. Persons outside the labour force are also referred to as the "inactive population" and may include, school children, students, pensioners, the sick and housewives or -men, for example, provided that they are not working at all and not available or looking for work either; some of these may be of working-age.

The Outside Labour Force or inactivity rate is the proportion of people outside the labour force (i.e. economically inactive persons) in the total population of the same age group. **Table 6.1** shows the estimated overall Outside Labour Force rate or Inactive rate at 40.8 percent, with females and males recording 43.9 and 37.1 percent respectively. The ratio for females was higher than their male counterparts for all the age groups except for age group 55-59.

The estimated total number of persons outside labour force was 668,088, out of which 41.3 percent (275,997) were males and 58.7 percent (392,092) were females. Persons outside the labour force were concentrated in age groups from 15 to 29 years. The 15-17 year age group recorded 19.4 percent, followed by the 20-24 years group with 12.2 percent. The age groups 25-29 and 18-19 recorded 7.9 and 8.0 percent respectively. See **Table 6.2 below**

Table LFO1 from **Appendix 3**, shows that persons in household responsibilities or homemakers accounted for 31.5 percent of the population outside the labour force. These were followed by persons engaged in Studies or Training who recorded 29.3 percent while the Relaxed job seekers accounted for 14.2 percent of the population outside the labour force.

People who were in schooling or studying were concentrated in the age groups from 15 to 24 years. The 15-17 age group recorded 60.5 percent, followed by the 20-24 and 18-19 with 16.8 and 16.0 percent respectively. See **Table LFO2**.

8.0 THE IMPACT OF COVID - 19 TO EMPLOYMENT & HOUSEHOLD ENTERPRISES

8.1 INTRODUCTION

With the outbreak of the coronavirus in December 2019 and its spread across the world, the World Health Organization (WHO) declared the coronavirus disease, COVID-19, as world pandemic on 11th March 2020. Botswana recorded confirmed cases in March 2020, and went on lockdown on the 2nd of April I 2020, which was lifted on the 22nd of May 2020. While the first lockdown was lifted on 22nd May 2020 extreme social distancing, travel restrictions, meetings and workshops restrictions were encouraged.

The outbreak of COVID-19 has affected many countries worldwide differently. It has come with both negative and positive impacts. Economies have been adversely affected. There have increases in the levels of unemployment as people lost their jobs and life due to the pandemic. On the other side some people gained employment due to the existence of COVID-19.

This chapter seeks to capture the impact of COVID-19 on jobs and businesses.

8.2 Summary of Survey Results

The 522,618 people who have stated that they were working or having businesses since the first Covid 19 lockdown, indicated that they have been affected by the pandemic in their jobs or businesses in Different ways, which is being shown by **Table 7.1** below. Even though some people have lost their jobs during this period of the pandemic, there were people who found jobs or business opportunities through the activities which are related to COVID-19.

8.2.1 Currently Employed due to Covid-19

Covid-19 crisis has impacted on employment in the labour force. There were people who lost their jobs or businesses, and some businesses that shut down. On the other hand, there was labour force that gained employment or opened businesses as a result of "opportunities" deriving from the COVID-19 pandemic some people have gained from this crisis. Some have found jobs, some have found new businesses and some businesses also have went up.

From the QMTS Q4 2021 survey results, a total of 17,770 persons reported to have found employment because of Covid 19. From this total females had the largest share, with 12,720 persons whereas 5,050 were males. This is a decrease of 1,342 persons over a period of twelve months (from a total of 19,112 persons which was recorded in Q4 2020).




Figure 7.0: Number of Persons who found Employment due to COVID 19, QMTS Q4 2021

8.2.2 Population that lost Jobs/ Businesses due to Covid 19

The results estimated the total number of persons who lost jobs or businesses due to Covid-19 at 64, 347 persons. The majority of persons affected by the pandemic were females.




Figure 7.2: Percentage of population that lost jobs/ businesses due to Covid by Age Group and Sex- Q4_2020

Analysis of job/ business loss by age group is shown in Figure 7.2 below. The results indicate that job/businesses loss was more prevalent amongst the youth in age group 25-29. This group recorded 18.1 percent of all persons who lost jobs due to Covid. Age groups 30-34 and 35-39 followed with 15.4 percent each. Job/ business loss was relatively low from age group 55-59 to 70-74, with age group 70-74 recording of 0.7 percent. Age groups 15-19 and 75+ recorded no job/ business loss.

The results indicate that Secondary school leavers were the most prevalent job/ business losers due to Covid 19. These recorded 59.5 percent (38,297) of the total job/ business loses, followed by Primary school leavers with 13.8 percent (8,859). Persons who never attended school recorded 6.4 percent (4,143) of job/ business losses. Table 7.8

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Analysis at stratum level indicates that more job/ business loss was in Urban Villages with a total of 29,631 persons (46.0 percent). Rural Areas and Cities & Towns recorded 31.0 and 23.0 percent respectively. (Table 7.9)

8.2.3 Population that lost Jobs/ Businesses due to Covid-19 and are now working

Out of the total of 64,347 persons who reported to have lost jobs/ businesses due to Covid-19, 8.2 percent (5,280) were able to find new jobs. The majority of person who were able to find new jobs/ businesses were males with 60.5 percent, while females recorded 30.4 percent.

Comparison of job/business loss due to Covid 19 between quarter four 2020 and quarter four 2021 depicts a reduction of 4.1 percent (2,785) in the number of jobs/ businesses lost.

Service/Sales Workers Elementary occupations recorded the highest new jobs/ business with 29.7 percent. Craft & Related Trades Workers and Elementary Occupations recorded 24.5 and 16.8 percent respectively. Professionals, Technicians & Associate professionals and Other specialised professionals did not record any new job/business found by persons who lost jobs/ businesses due to Covid 19. (Table 7.10)

The population that lost jobs/ businesses due to Covid-19 and is currently seeking work is displayed in **Table 7.11** below. A total of 30,642 persons reported to be looking for jobs/ businesses. This constitutes 47.6 percent of the total population that lost jobs/ businesses due to Covid-19.

Age group 25-29 years reported the highest percentage (19.2 percent) of the job seekers. This was followed by age groups 30-34 and 35-39 years with 17.1 and 16.6 percent respectively.

Table 7.12 shows Job seekers by Education Level, Region and sex. Urban villages had the highest job seekers with a record of 15,247 persons (49.8 percent). Cities & Towns followed with 8,239 (26.9 percent) whilst Rural Areas recorded 7,156 persons (23.4 percent). Job seekers by education indicates that Secondary school levers recorded 64.3 percent of the job seekers. Of these, 49.0 percent are in Urban Villages, 28.0 percent in Cities & Towns and 23.0 percent in Rural Areas.

APPENDIX 1: Definition of Terms and Concepts

Population in Labour Force (Economically Active Population)

Population in Labour Force or Economically Active Population refers to the combination of the employed and unemployed Population. This provides a measure of the number of persons providing and ready to supply labour for the production of goods and services at a given point in time.

Employed Persons

Persons who did some work in the reference period either for payment in cash or kind (paid employees) or who were in self-employment for profit or family gain, plus persons temporarily absent from these activities but definitely going to return to them (e.g. on leave or sick). So generally the above statement means that there are 2 types of persons involved in employment, being:-

Employed, at work: Worked for pay or profit for at least 1 hour

Employed, not at work: Worked already in the job, but not at work due to: Working time arrangement (shift work, flexi time) temporary absence (expects to return within short period).

Unemployed Persons

The unemployed persons or population can be described as all persons in the working age group 15 and above whom during a specified short reference period (30 days or 4 weeks) were seeking and also being available for work. Generally Unemployed persons are defined as working age persons who were: Not employed in last 7 days / reference week but available to work.

Carried out activities to seek employment in last 4 weeks / reference month Available to start job/business in reference week OR in short period.

Population Outside Labour Force (Currently Not Economically Active)

Population Outside Labour Force or The economically inactive population comprises all persons who were neither "employed" nor "unemployed" during the short reference period (7 days), used to measure "current activity". This population is split into four groups:

Attendant at educational institutions; Retired; Engaged in family duties; -Other economically inactive.

Unemployed

The persons who are unemployed are the ones who were not only available for work but had taken active steps to find work in the last 30 days or 4 weeks.

Unemployment Rate

Unemployment rate is the proportion of the unemployed population to the Total Labour Force (Employed + Unemployed).

Relaxed or Discouraged Job Seekers

Relaxed or Discouraged Job Seekers are persons currently unemployed who have not taken active steps to find work due to different reasons in the last 30 days or 4 weeks, but they are available to work.

Extended Unemployment Rate

This is the calculation of unemployment rate including people who were actively seeking work and those who were not seeking work due to different reasons attached to the labour market.

Labour Under Utilisation

Labour underutilisation refers to mismatches between labour supply and demand that translate into an unmet need for employment among the population. Measures of **labour underutilisation** include:

- 1. Time-related underemployment, when the working time of persons in employment is insufficient in relation to alternative employment situations in which they are willing and available to engage.
- 2. Unemployment, reflecting an active job search by persons not in employment who are available for work.
- 3. Potential labour force, referring to persons not in employment who express an interest in work but whom existing conditions limit their active job search and/or their availability.

Temporary absences from employment

This refers to persons not working in the reference period but having work from which they are temporarily absent. Such a person is included in the employed population provided they keep a strong attachment to the job and there is a definite expectation he/she will return to it. The most common categories are persons on leave from a wage job.

Usually Employed - Persons who were usually employed are those who in the previous 6 or more months in the last 12 months were employed, but also who currently are not employed.

Usual Economic Activity

This is the economic activity done in reference to the long term period of time, usually referred to the previous 12 months.

Current Economic Activity

This is the economic activity done in reference to the short period of time, usually referred to the previous 7 days

Paid Employees are persons who during the reference week performed some work for a wage or salary in cash or kind or were temporarily absent from such work. Permanent, temporary and casual paid employees were also included.

Self Employed are persons who during the reference week performed some work for profit or family gain or were temporarily absent from such work. This includes small and large business people working on their own enterprises. The category can be sub-divided into self-employment with or without employees.

Central Government - Refers to persons working for all Central Government Departments. This includes all Teachers in Government Primary and Secondary schools (including community secondary schools) plus food stampers and night watchmen in schools.

Local Government - Includes persons working for District and Urban Councils. There are a few pre-schools under Local Government.

Ipelegeng - Persons employed on drought relief projects which mostly are under Local Government.

Parastatals - includes the wide range of enterprises owned at least 50% by the government, either profit making or non-profit making. These are enterprises which are exercising certain corporate or business functions and also have rights in connection with public duties. Parastatals are companies in the private sector which are supported by the government with a public mandate to provide a given service.

Informal Sector - According to the definitions, an establishment/unit qualified to be of an informal activity if it satisfied the following criteria:-

- 1. Not registered as a company
- 2. Not registered with a professional association
- 3. Less than 5 employees
- 4. Informal accounts or none
- 5. Expenditure not easily distinguishable from household expenditure
- 6. Employees casually hired
- 7. Often temporary or mobile or in the owner's home/plot

Formal Sector employment refers to work in an establishment which is registered as a company, keeps set of formal accounts and has employed five or more employees. In general Formal Sector Employment comprise of people who are working in the companies which fall under the following categories:

- 1. Companies which are formally registered with
 - a. Tax Authorities,
 - b. Department of Trade and Industry
 - c. Professional Institutions
- 2. The threshold for Formal Sector Employment Surveys in terms of employment in Botswana include companies employing 5 employees and above.
- 3. The Companies or Businesses must have an office or a permanent structure of location, they are not supposed to be operating in Households.

Formal Employment

Formal employment or jobs refers to work in which an establishment engages an employee under a working agreement that includes, salary or wages, health benefits, defined work hours and workdays. This include employment which is liable for taxation, pension or gratuity, paid leave, maternity leave, allowances, medical services, etc.

Occupation

Occupation covers duties that a person performs most of the time when that person is at work. The persons occupation depends on the tasks and duties which that person performs.

Industry

Industry tries to cover the main kind of product produced or the main service provided by the company or the work unit of an individual.

Appendix 2: Survey Methodology

SURVEY DESIGN METHODOLOGY - QUARTERLY MULTI TOPIC SURVEY 2019

1.0 Introduction

The Quarterly MultiTopic Survey (QMTS) is a household-based sample survey conducted by Statistics Botswana which collects data mainly on the labour market activity of individuals aged 15 years and above in the country. The main objective of the CMTHS is to collect quarterly information about persons in the labour market, i.e. those who are employed; those who are unemployed and those who are not economically active. The essence of the quarterly period is to monitor the change of the labour trends between the quarters in the country.

The peculiarity of the survey is realised in the major distinction in the survey methodology from other Labour Force Surveys carried out before in the country. This revision or methodology will result in changes to the frequency of data collection and data releases, and the survey data capture and processing systems. Unlike its predecessor BMTHS, the CMTHS is more focused on labour issues.

2.0 Sampling Design

The Sampling Frame and sample selection are based on the last Population and Housing Census which was undertaken in 2011. In 2011 PHC, there were 5 203 Primary Sampling Units (PSUs) and 550 243 households constituting the sampling frame with a population of 2,024, 904 persons. Only private dwellings would be within the scope of the survey. Institutional dwellings (prisons, hospitals, army barracks, hotels, etc.), and EAs with completely industrial area buildings would not be within the scope of the survey. The coverage would be nation-wide using census districts (administrative district and sub-districts) that are usually used by Statistics Botswana in most surveys and censuses.

The census result gives information on population, number of household at Locality, Enumeration Area (EA), village and district/town levels. Also given for each EA is information on ecological zones in rural areas. The Sampling frame was defined and constituted by all Enumeration Areas (EAs) found in three geographical regions, otherwise known as domains and these are (i) Cities & Towns (ii) Urban Villages, and (iii) Rural areas as defined by the 2011 PHC.

2.01 Design assumptions

The predicted or anticipated prevalence (coverage rate) for the key indicator used is the unemployment rate= 17.6% (BMTHS 2015)

The margin of error or allowable error to be tolerated (in general 1 percentage points) = $0.015 \approx 1\%$. The sample design effect (a ratio of the expected sampling variance from the sampling design to be used compared to that of a simple random sample of the same size. It is a measure of how much more unreliable the present survey is compared to a simple random sample); Deff. = 1.5

The average household size used is = 3.68 (2011 PHC)

A specific percentage for non-response (for example g=1/0.95 = 1.05 to raise the sample size by 5 percent).

Turner (2000) and Vijay Verma suggested D0.65, as a factor necessary to increase the national sample size, where D is the number of domains (cities/tows, urban villages and rural areas), D=3^0.65=2.04, the sample size should be designed necessarily to generate national estimates, however more often the subnational estimates are required to inform policy decisions and

The proportion of the total population in the specified target group; population >15 years (BMTHS 2015) = 0.656

Cluster size was fixed to m=12, translating to Inter Cluster Correlation (ICC) = (DEFF - 1) / (m - 1) = (1.5-1)/(12-1) = 0.045 = 4.5 percent. Fixing the cluster is important for self-weighting and improves precision. Due to homogeneity factor, it is assumed that the cluster size of 12 will serve the optimum purpose and increasing it will have a tendency of increasing the standard errors, and costs unnecessarily

2.02 Final sample size and methodology

Based on the final calculation of QMTS 2019, a sample of 270 PSUs, translating to 3,885 households was selected with Probability Proportional to Size (PPS) method; where Measure of size (MOS) is the number of households as enumerated from the 2011 Population & Housing Census.

The sample size will be segmented into four (4) rotation groups where each rotation group is made up of a representative subset (68 PSUs) of the full sample which is 25%. The sampled households in a particular rotation

group are rotated in the same quarter, i.e. Group 1 rotated in Q1, Group 2 rotated in Q2, etc. Therefore, each sampled households (hhlds) remain in the sample for 4 consecutive quarters. This is not a full panel, it is at a ratio of 75:25, where 25% of the sample is being rotated across the strata of the main sample to ensure representativeness. This implies that 25% of the households will not be rotated, but enumerated in the life span of the sample. Rotation means that these households are replaced by new households from the same EA or the next EA on the list, which is intuitively refreshing of the sample.

In conclusion, the 25% rotation tends to refresh the sample to reduce respondent fatigue and introduce few changes into labour characteristics while keeping the 75% of the sample. This will give good indications on the changes between the quarters on labour force trends by keeping the same households in the sample for a while. This is a recommended and preferred methodology because the use of cross sectional methodology implies bringing a new sample each quarter; and thus will not reflect actual changes in the labour force characteristics per quarter but rather quarterly estimates.

3.0 Weighting

Sample weights for the data collected from the sampled households are constructed so that the responses could be properly expanded and generalized to represent the entire populace. They involve array of factors such as the unequal probability of selection of the PSUs, EA adjustments according to the sample and adjustment for non-response.
