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Introduction

Economic Statistics

The Economic Statistics contained in this section are the most recent available at the time of preparation. The economic Statistics presented covers; National Accounts, Prices, Trade, Tourism, Agriculture, Industry, Environment, Wildlife and Transport & Infrastructure.

A brief summary is provided followed by tables and charts for some statistics areas.

Consumer Price Index (CPI)

Information on Consumer Price Index is summarized on Table 4 through 6. The national year-on-year inflation rate for the entire 2016 was 2.8 percent on average compared to the 2015 figure of 3.1 percent. There was an increase in the national month-on-month inflation rate from 2.7 percent in January to 3.0 percent in December 2016. The cities/towns' inflation rate went up from 2.7 percent in January 2016 to 2.8 percent in December 2016. The urban and rural villages' inflation rates also increased from 2.6 to 3.0 percent and from 2.8 to 3.5 percent, respectively during January and December 2016.

The national Cost-of-Living index increased from 97.9 to 100.5 between January and December 2016 showing an increase of 2.6 percent between the periods. This compares with an increase of 2.3 percent from 95.4 to 97.6 during the same period of the previous year. The cities/towns, urban villages and rural indices rose from 97.9 to 100.5, 98.1 to 100.4 and 97.7 to 100.8, respectively between January and December 2016. Average inflation rate for Food &Non-Alcoholic Beverages group increased by 1.4 of a percentage point from 1.3 percent in 2015 to 2.7 percent in 2016. Miscellaneous Goods & Services had the highest average inflation rate in 2016 at 7.5%.

Figure 1: INFLATION TREND JANUARY TO DECEMBER, 2016







Figure 2: COST OF LIVING INDEX IN 2016**Figure 3: INFLATION RATE FOR CPI MAJOR COMMODITIES (GROUPS) 2016****2.1.3 Gross Domestic Product (GDP)**

GDP at nominal prices for 2016 is estimated at P169, 688.0 million, compared with a revised estimate of P145, 923.5 million in 2014, which is a 16.3 percent increase. At current prices, GDP per capita increased from a revised estimate of 66,756.7 in 2015 to 76,446.4 in 2016.

GDP per capita decreased from 39,380.0 in 2015 to 40,444.7 in 2016, showing an increase of 2.7 percent in real terms.


Figure 4: OVERALL GDP AND GDP PER CAPITA INCOME OVER THE YEARS, 2011-2015**GDP by Economic activity:**

Real GDP increased by 4.3 percent in 2016 compared to a decrease of 1.7 percent registered in 2015. The increase in real GDP was mainly attributed to Trade, Hotels & Restaurants and Transport & communications industries which recorded an increase in value added of 13.5, and 5.6 percent respectively. All other industries recorded a positive growth with the exception of Mining and Agriculture which declined by 3.7 and 1.0 percent respectively.

A decrease in the real value added of the Mining industry was attributed to a decline in copper/nickel value added by 21.2 percent in 2016. In the year under review, copper production decreased by 22.4 percent due to provisional liquidation of BCL mine in October 2016. Mowana and Thakadu copper mines were put on provisional liquidation in the fourth quarter of 2015. Boseto copper mine (Discovery metals)/Khoemacau was liquidated in the second quarter of 2015.

In 2016, Mining and Trade, Hotels & Restaurants remained the major contributors to GDP, their contributions stood at 19.9 percent and 18.3 percent respectively.

Figure 5: ECONOMIC GROWTH BY ECONOMIC ACTIVITY, 2000-2016




Transport

Air Transport

In 2016, aircraft movements increased by 3.5 percent after registering 77,079 movements from 74,472 movements recorded in 2015. Disaggregating aircraft movements within this period, it shows that international aircraft movements went up by 1.1 percent when compared to 2015. International scheduled and private aircraft movements increased by 3.2 and 0.8 percent respectively while international non-scheduled aircraft movements declined by 3.2 percent. Most of aircraft movements which occurred in 2016 were in Maun. Maun accounted for 58.1 percent of total movements. This is justifiable as Maun is a tourist destination, and as such receives most of non-scheduled aircrafts. Sir Seretse Khama International Airport (SSKIA) accounted for 22.6 percent of total aircraft movements. The airport that had the least number of movements was Selebi Phikwe with 0.1 percent of total aircraft movements. See Figure 6 below.

Air passenger traffic increased by 6.0 percent in 2016, from 720,906 passengers recorded in 2015 to 764,146 passengers in 2016. International traffic recorded an increase of 6.4 percent while domestic traffic went up by 5.5 percent. All types of movements, international arrivals and departures, domestic arrivals and departures realized increases. Sir Seretse Khama International Airport contributed 52.7 percent of total air passenger traffic while Maun made the second highest contribution of 30.2 percent. The airport which contributed the least number of air passenger traffic was Selebi Phikwe at 0.04 percent. All air passenger traffic types realized an increase in 2016, with international arrivals and departures increasing by 6.2 and 6.5 percent respectively. Domestic air passenger arrivals and departures increased by 6.2 and 4.7 percent respectively. Details are shown in Figure 7 below.

Figure 7: INTERNATIONAL AND DOMESTIC PASSENGER MOVEMENTS, 2007-2016




Road Transport

National Vehicle Stock


In 2016, the number of licensed vehicles in Botswana increased by 6.5 percent from 469,664 vehicles registered in 2015 to 500,316 vehicles. From 2007 to 2016, national vehicle stock increased by 117.05 percent, growing at an average annual rate of 8.2 percent. This is shown in Figure 8 below.

Private Vehicle Stock

Total privately owned vehicles went up from 457,407 in 2015, to 487,523 in 2016, registering an increase of 6.6 percent. This growth was mainly contributed by passenger cars and vans, which increased by 8.3 percent and 1.6 percent respectively. Passenger cars and vans made up 61.7 and 21.3 percent of total privately owned vehicles. All categories of vehicles, except Tankers and Horses, experienced growth. The most notable growth was in motor cycles which registered a 29.2 percent increase from 1,741 motor cycles in 2015 to 2,250 motor cycles in 2016. This is shown in [figure 9](#) below.



Rail Transport

Goods conveyed through rail increased by 2.5 percent in 2016, from 2,007,005 net tonnes in 2015 to 2,057,402 net tonnes in 2016. This increase may have resulted from the increase in transit traffic which grew by 388.6 percent. Other rail traffic categories realized a decrease.

Imports transported through rail declined by 15.1 percent while rail transported exports declined by 10.3 percent. [See Figure 10](#) and [Table A](#) below.

The number of people who used the Kazungula Pontoon to either cross in or go out of Botswana in 2016 was 502,759, showing an increase of 5.5 percent from the number recorded in 2015. Of this total, 75.6 percent were foreigners while 24.4 percent were Botswana citizens. Out of total number of foreigners, 49.8 percent were arrivals into Botswana while 50.2 percent were departing from Botswana. See **Table B** above.



In 2016, there were 63,168 vehicles transported using the Pontoon, which is a 14.1 percent decrease over the 73,544 vehicles transported in 2015. Of these vehicles, 52.1 percent were leaving the country while 47.9 percent were entering the country. When compared to 2015, the number of vehicles leaving the country declined by 29.5 percent and those entering the country increased by 12.7 percent. See **Table C** above.

Mineral Production Statistics

Index of Mining Production stood at 83.1 in 2016, compared to 84.6 in 2015, signifying a decrease of 1.8 percent. The slump in growth of mining production was attributed to the varied trading conditions and unstable market demand of the associated commodities which saw the closure of base metal mines. Diamonds, Gold and Soda Ash brought some resilience to the mining production fall, contributing positively, nevertheless, they failed to sway the overall production to a positive side because their contribution was too insignificant.



Figure 11: PERCENTAGE CHANGE IN THE VOLUME OF MINING PRODUCTION, 2015 -2016



In 2016, total electricity generation decreased by 2.9 percent (71,786 MWH) from 2,445,988 MWH in 2015 to 2,374,202 MWH in 2016. During the same year, electricity generation experienced two episodes of negative growth compared to the same period in 2015, from February to August and October to November respectively. These decreases can be attributed to the operational challenges that affected Morupule B power station throughout the course of the year.

Social Statistics**Introduction**

The Social Statistics section provides a comprehensive and detailed statistical overview of Botswana's population, Health, Education, Poverty and Labour. The section gives a detailed picture for each statistics area covered in the form of text, tables and graphs.

Education

The official statistics published assist in policy formulation, monitoring and evaluation of the existing education policies, inform sector planning and decision making. Furthermore, the statistics serves as evidence on the country's progress towards meeting national and international obligations and benchmarks on provision of education. Education data covers all levels of education, notably, pre-primary, primary, secondary, technical & vocational, and tertiary.

Education statistics are compiled using data obtained through annual school census, supplemented by administrative data as well as data obtained through household surveys as well as Population and Housing Census.

Table E above shows that the number of pre-primary schools increased from 570 in 2013 to 645 in 2014. On the other hand pre-primary enrolment increased from 29,150 to 33,425 between 2013 and 2014.


Figure 13: PRIMARY SCHOOL ENROLMENT BY SEX – 2009-2013

Figure 13 shows that Primary school enrolment has been increasing over the past six years. The enrolment increased from 330,745 in 2009 to 340,700 in 2014.


Figure 14: PERCENTAGE OF SECONDARY SCHOOLS BY SCHOOL OWNERSHIP -2005-2014

Figure 14 shows that government schools constituted 82.00 percent or more of all schools for the past 10 years. The percentage of government schools increased from 83 percent in 2005 to 87.2 percent in 2007 and thereafter reduced to 82.5 percent in 2013 and 81.8 percent in 2014 due to increase in private schools. On the other hand the percentage of private schools fluctuated between 11.3 and 16.8 percent. The percentage of government aided schools remained around 1.4 percent mainly because the number of schools has remained constant over the years. The graph indicates that government is the main provider of secondary education.


Figure 15: PRIMARY SCHOOL DROP OUT RATES BY SEX – 2008-2013

Figure 15 shows that primary school dropout rate reduced from 1.1 percent in 2008 to 0.6 in 2013. The rate for boys reduced from 1.4 percent in 2008 to 0.7 percent in 2013 while the rate for girls reduced from 0.8 percent to 0.4 percent during the same period. Furthermore the analysis shows that primary school boys dropped from school at a higher rate than girls across the years.




Figure 16: TERTIARY EDUCATION GROSS ENROLMENT RATIOS (TEGER) FOR POPULATION 18-24 YEARS- 2003 - 2016
